One bill sets aside over \$1 billion to construct border barriers, and the second increases sentences for human trafficking. The third — known as House Bill 4 — would allow local police to arrest and deport illegal migrants. The bill will now head to the state Senate, where Republicans maintain a similarly commanding majority and are expected to approve the legislation.</p> <p>Homeland Security Investigations agents raided Elsa City Hall, as well as two other locations in the Delta region yesterday morning. It's part of an ongoing money laundering investigation.</p> <p>San Benito police Lt. Milton Resendez was killed following a shooting last week during a police chase. He was laid to rest yesterday. Lt. Resendez served with the San Benito Police Department for almost 26 years. He leaves behind his wife of 25 years. Please keep her and other family members in your prayers.</p> <p>The Mission Police Department is one of several police departments in the Valley that will be increasing their patrol units for Halloween. The goal is to keep the children safe and keep distracted drivers off the streets.</p> <p>PM News:</p> <p>A massive search is underway for 40-year-old Robert Card, the man accused of being the gunman who left 18 people dead in a mass killing at a restaurant and a bowling alley in Lewiston, Maine.</p> <p>At least 27 people were killed by Hurricane Otis, which made landfall on Mexico's Pacific coast on Wednesday. Acapulco was among the areas worst hit with 80% of the resort's hotels damaged and streets flooded.</p> <p>Israel's military said it carried out a ground operation in the Gaza Strip, where for nearly three weeks Israeli forces have been conducting airstrikes targeting Hamas militants. The IDF said the operation was done to prepare "for the next stages of combat."</p> <p>Ford Motor says many customers in North America are no longer willing to pay a premium for an electric vehicle over an internal-combustion or hybrid alternative. Therefore, Ford will postpone about \$12 billion in planned spending on manufacturing capacity for EVs.</p>

Voters had the opportunity to vote on Proposition 4, an amendment to the Texas Constitution, in the Nov. 7 election. Now that the proposal has been approved, homeowners will begin seeing tax savings in their 2023 tax bill.</p> <p>Texas voters refused to increase the retirement age of judges during Tuesday’s constitutional amendment election. Proposition 13 was the only amendment on Texans’ ballots that did not pass.</p> <p>Gov. Greg Abbott called a fourth special session which began immediately after the 3rd special session gaveled out late yesterday afternoon. This year has been defined by acrimony between the state's Republican leaders whose personal feuds have so far prevented deals on allowing families to use public school money for private schools and allowing local and state police to arrest people they suspect crossed into Texas illegally.</p> <p>The U.S. Supreme Court heard arguments yesterday for a case involving a Texas man challenging the government’s ability to disarm people who are subject to a domestic violence restraining order. A decision could take months.</p> <p>PM News:</p> <p>Israeli defense minister said his troops are in Gaza City, adding that the strip will be run by neither Hamas nor Israel when the war is over.</p> <p>Washington and NATO allies said Tuesday they will echo Russia's suspension of a Cold War treaty to limit conventional arms proliferation in Europe.</p> <p>Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy vowed that his country would become a member of the European Union. "Our prayers are with all the affected families, and we share in their grief during this most challenging time."</p> <p>Ohio voters sent a resounding message to the nation: the Buckeye State is overwhelmingly pro-abortion. Ohioans voted in landslide numbers to amend the state's constitution to enshrine a woman's right to abortion up to the child's birth date. Chris Crowder, associate pastor and CEO of the school, is the one who called all the teenagers from inside the school to come help. "I didn't really know what was going on," Crowder said. "I looked across the parking lot and noticed the car and they were screaming and so I ran over there and I looked under the car and I saw mom and child underneath the car pinned. It was split second. I immediately just ran into the building because I knew I had to get a lot of people to lift this car." School surveillance video of the parking lots shows the kids running out of the school and surrounding the car to pick it up. An airman from Hill Air Force Base then pulled the mom and child to safety. The lesson for the kids that day was that working together can have positive results.</p>
