Texas Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick and House Speaker Dade Phelan issued a joint statement to announce the agreement on the proposed legislation that will be the biggest property tax cut in Texas history. Over \$12 billion will be spent on reducing the school property tax rate for all homeowners and business properties. And every homeowner who homesteads their home (approximately 5.7 million homeowners) will get a \$100,000 homestead exemption.</p> <p>Gov. Greg Abbott has named a second interim attorney general to stand in for Ken Paxton who was automatically suspended in May after the Texas House voted to impeach him over allegations of misconduct and crimes. The governor appointed Angela Colmenero as the state next interim attorney general after announcing his first pick, Fort Worth attorney John Scott, was leaving the position.</p> <p>The city of Roma hopes to get water test results by tomorrow. In the meantime, the boil water notice remains in effect. The notice was first put into place on July 5 when two pumps failed, causing pressure issues.</p> <p>According to an annual report issued by the Environment Texas Research and Policy Center, South Padre Island beaches were found to be one of the safest beaches for swimming in Texas. They looked at data taken at beaches across the state.</p> <p>PM News:</p> <p>In a surprising change of tune Monday, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has apparently agreed to advance Sweden bid for NATO membership. The agreement also allows Turkey into the European Union.</p> <p>The U.S. Marine Corps does not have a confirmed leader for the first time in 164 years, following Marine Corps Commandant Gen. David Berger's relinquish-of-command ceremony held Monday and Berger's private retirement ceremony. Gen. Eric Smith is the acting Commandant.</p> <p>Around 84,000 Woom bicycles for children are being recalled because the handlebars could come off while riding, posing a risk that children using them could be unable to steer and fall. 19 injuries have been reported from this happening.</p> <p>User traffic on Twitter has slowed since the launch of Meta text-based platform Threads, which has already surpassed 100 million sign-ups since its debut last week.</p>

Freddie Mac reports the average 30-year fixed-rate mortgage has risen to 6.8%, but even borrowers with good credit scores are paying north of 7%.</p> <p>Inflation has come down in recent months but many prices haven't. Consumer watchdog agency Accountable. Us recently issued a new analysis that found Kimblyerly-Clark, Pepsi, and others admit to have benefited from increased prices as their net profits increased.</p> <p>Kids might not want to hear this but back to school sales are already starting. Flood waters closed and damaged roads, left vehicles under water, and flooded homes. Lord, we pray for protection for everyone in the northeast facing these floods.</p> <p>Health officials are reporting a deadly outbreak of cholera in the South African province of Gauteng. Authorities say nearly 50 people have died, with most of the deaths concentrated in one area, however, cases have been reported in other areas as well. Medical officials have urged residents to be vigilant about what they consume and to practice good hygiene, like hand washing. Bishop Marcus Campbell, pastor of The Church at Mt. Carmel in North Nashville, died from heart problems. Campbell was also the founder of a nonprofit program called Gentleman and not Gangsters (GANG), which partnered with the court system to help troubled youth. Davidson County Register of Deeds Karen Johnson said Campbell's death will be very hard because the city has lost a true impact servant leader.</p> <p>The vast majority of Americans — 96 percent — do not hold to a biblical worldview following the COVID-19 lockdowns, according to a new survey. Calling it a "significant change" in Americans' worldview, the Cultural Research Center of Arizona Christian University led by researcher George Barna found in its survey that the lockdowns impacted the already-dwindling number of people who claim to hold a biblical worldview. A biblical worldview, the survey said, is one in which the entirety of a person's "ideas about all dimensions of life and eternity are based on biblical principles and commands.</p>

However, commissioners are considering a 5% pay hike for all county employees.</p> <p>Lawyers for Gov. It's an indication that consumers are continuing to spend freely.</p> <p>North Korea claims that a U.S. soldier who bolted into the North across the heavily armed Korean border last month did so after being disillusioned at the inequality of American society.</p> <p>Congressional leaders' top prospect to avert a government shutdown when Congress returns from its month-long break appears a bit clearer this week as reports indicate the top leaders in both chambers are open to a short-term funding measure.</p>

The U.S. Department of Agriculture reports Florida's orange crop this year is even smaller than forecast. Prices could start rising later this fall.</p> <p>Homebuyers continue to face challenges. Last week mortgage rates ticked higher, getting closer to 7%. Freddie Mac reported the average 30-year fixed-rate mortgage rate increased to 6.96%. That's 1.74% higher than a year ago.</p> <p>Want to live longer? A new study from the European Society of Cardiology finds you can reduce your risk of death by walking just four thousand steps a day. Conventional wisdom suggests you need to walk 10 thousand steps, but the researchers say it's not necessary.</p>

Last week's inferno on the island of Maui is already the deadliest U.S. wildfire in a century, with only a quarter of the ruins of the devastated town of Lahaina searched for victims so far. Lord, we pray for all affected by these fires, your comfort on grieving families, and we pray more of the missing will be found alive.</p> <p>Four months into the war in Sudan, humanitarian leaders are highlighting the devastating impact the brutal conflict has had on millions of people whose lives have been destroyed and whose basic human rights have been violated. 				<p>A Mexican cargo train with hundreds of migrants who hopped onboard in Monterrey was stopped nearly 150 miles from its final destination of Piedras Negras, not too far from where thousands of illegal crossings occur daily in Eagle Pass, Texas. A concern of some is if the train reaches its destination, the migrants will attempt to cross into the U.S. through Eagle Pass.</p> <p>Gov. Greg Abbott said his long-awaited special session on "school choice" will start next month while promising political consequences for lawmakers who stand in the way of his priority legislation. "There's an easy way to get it done, and there's a hard way," Abbott said on a tele- town hall about the issue. "We will take it either way — in a special session or after an election."</p> <p>Two environmental groups and an Indigenous tribe today will present appeals in their lawsuit against the State of Texas for closing a popular border beach for SpaceX tests. Arguments will be heard in the 13th Court of Appeals in Edinburg this morning. The groups are suing to keep Boca Chica Beach from repeated closures for test flights and SpaceX activity.</p> <p>Amazon said that it will hire 250,000 full- and part-time workers for the holiday season, a 67% jump compared to last year. Target announced it will add nearly 100,000 seasonal roles during the holidays, the same number as it did last year. Macy's said they will add about 38 thousand seasonal workers.</p> <p>PM News:</p> <p>U.S. House Speaker Kevin McCarthy said that he has delayed a key procedural vote for a 30- day stopgap funding measure intended to avert a government shutdown after current funding for federal agencies expires on Sept. 30. He said he first wants a lawmaker's vote on whether to open debate on a defense appropriations bill.</p> <p>Ukraine's efforts to break through Russia's defensive lines could soon benefit from some long- awaited firepower — some 31 U.S.-made M1 Abrams tanks first promised in January. The tanks should be delivered to Ukraine soon.</p> <p>House Republicans plan to hold their first hearing next week in their impeachment inquiry into President Joe Biden. The hearing — scheduled for Sept. 28 — is expected to focus on "constitutional and legal questions" that surround the allegations of Biden's involvement in his son Hunter's overseas businesses.</p> <p>The United Auto Workers union is stepping up pressure on Detroit's Big Three by threatening to expand its strike unless it sees major progress in contract negotiations by Friday.</p> <p>Planning to relocate during retirement? A new Consumer Affairs study ranks the best and worst U.S. Cities for retirement. According to the study many of the best</p>

Lord, we pray for the ability to control diseases resulting fromthe flood.</p> <p>Three Christians were gunned down by motorcyclists in Kurdistan, a semi-autonomous federal region of northern Iraq. All three were known in the community for their work sharing the Gospel and discipling new believers – both on the Iraq side and the Persian side of Kurdistan. However, there are questions as to whether this was a religious or political assassination. The investigation is ongoing. Lord, we pray for protection for Christians in Iraq.</p>

Then Josh took matters into his own hands once he realized the shark may have just needed a nudge back into the water. Following a couple of unsuccessful attempts on his own, three additional beachgoers opted to lend a hand. The agitated mako shark struggled and thrashed. At one point, it threw the rescuers aside.
