

4th Quarter 2013 Community Issues Report Summary

WYLN'S LATE EDITION: This is an hour-long news program that features news stories of local, regional and statewide issues, regularly featuring comments from local officials with roles in those stories and their effects. It also provides the viewing audience with information on daily events happening in the area and reports on local and national sports stories. Regional weather forecasts are also provided. It is produced live and runs Monday through Friday between 10 PM and 11 PM. It is rebroadcast the following morning at 8 AM. The format changed in the beginning of the 4th quarter. *(Video copies of this program are available upon request or may be viewed at WYLN's studios and offices during normal business hours. Scripts of the headlines run each day may be viewed at WYLN's studios and offices during normal business hours.*

TOPIC A LIVE AT 5: This is a live, daily discussion program about events and issues of local, regional and statewide importance. It also features several weather segments which give detailed forecasts and information for each different segment of our coverage area. It features a look at each day's news headlines and three extended segments of discussion of issues of importance locally, regionally and statewide. It airs Monday through Friday at 5 PM and is rebroadcast nightly at 7 PM. This program is a continuation of two earlier programs, **Topic A** and **35 Weather**. Those two programs had the same goals as the current show, but were done in separate half-hour programs. They began in 2010. They were combined into one program in the second quarter of 2011

THE STORM: Each week host, Tiffany Cloud, discusses issues and concerns of a political nature and important issues that are taking place in the area. Previously known as **Storm Politics**, which main focus was on political issues. The name change was made to increase the topic matter, and allow more guests to voice their opinions and concerns on the program. (video copies of shows available at WYLN in Hazleton).

WOMEN TODAY:A show for women, hosted by Liz Tolan, covering topics on dating, makeovers, home decorating, women in business, etc.

LIVE LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL: Beginning in September through November...Friday Night at 7:00 PM....rebroadcast on Saturday or Sunday as schedule permits.

LOCAL ELECTION RETURNS: Live election coverage of races around the viewing area during the General Election in November.

SOUNDS OF THE SEASONS COMMUNITY CONCERT: Broadcast in December from the Wiltsie Center in Hazleton it is a program featuring the Freeland community choir and Hazleton Area Philharmonic Orchestra.

CAN-DO CHRISTMAS CONCERT: Featuring choral and orchestra groups from the Hazleton Area School District at the Pennsylvania Performing Arts Center in Hazleton in December.

WELLNESS THRU PHYSICAL THERAPY: Hosted by Liz Tolan, the show features a local Physical Therapist discussing issues that can be treated through physical therapy.

LEGALLY SPEAKING: Hosted by Liz Tolan, it is a show that features a local Attorney from the Hazleton Area, discussing legal matters.

OFF THE BEATEN PATH: A locally produced program that features three separate segments highlighting the fun and interesting people and places in Pennsylvania. Hosts include, Jeff Bonomo, Ken Cara, Chris Fulmer.

LET'S TALK CHIROPRACTIC: Locally produced show that features two Chiropractors from the Hazleton area. Hosted by Liz Tolan along with co-hosts Dr. John Degenhart and Dr. Stacie Sando from the Degenhart Chiropractic Health Center . Guests on the show discuss health issues that were treated by Dr. Degehart and Dr Sando.

JENTASTIC SWEETS: Hosted by Chef Jen Yamola who gives viewers a first hand lessons on baking sweet treats.

THE CHEF LOU SHOW: Hosted by Chef Lou, he gives viewers a first hand lesson at making dinner style food with an Italian flare.
