1st Quarter 2015 Community Issues Report Summary

WYLN'S LATE EDITION – This is an hour-long news program that features news stories of local, regional and statewide issues, regularly featuring comments from local officials with roles in those stories and their effects. It also provides the viewing audience with information on daily events happening in the area and reports on local and national sports stories. Regional weather forecasts are also provided. It is produced live and runs Monday through Friday between 10 PM and 11 PM. It is rebroadcast the following morning at 8 AM. (*Video copies of this program are available upon request or may be viewed at WYLN's studios and offices during normal business hours. Scripts of the headlines run each day may be viewed at WYLN's studios and offices during normal business hours.*

TOPIC A LIVE AT 5 – This is a program produced live every Friday. Hosted by Gary Perna, formally hosted by Ann Gownley. Guests on the show talk about issues of local, regional and statewide importance, along with important upcoming events that concern the public. This program is community oriented, and features local politicians, community leaders, and non-profit organizations. Topic A Live at 5, rebroadcasts seven times over the course of a week. This program is a continuation of two earlier programs, **Topic A** and **35 Weather**. Those two programs had the same goals , but were done in separate half-hour programs. They began in 2010. They were combined into one program in the second quarter of 2011 and official changed during the 2nd quarter.

LIVE LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL: Live local sporting event featuring local teams. The basketball games are produced between January and February of the first quarter.

ACS TELETHON: Held in March, it's a live one day telethon for the local charter of the American Cancer Society. It's broadcast 11:00 am to 11:00 pm Saturday at the Laurel Mall in Hazle Township.

THE STORM - Each week host, Tiffany Cloud, discusses issues and concerns of a political nature and important issues that are taking place in the area. Previously known as **Storm Politics**, which main focus was on political issues. The name change was made to increase the topic matter, and allow more guests to voice their opinions and concerns on the program. (video copies of shows available at WYLN in Hazleton).

WOMEN TODAY: A show for women, hosted by Liz Tolan, covering topics on dating, makeovers, home decorating, women in business, etc.

OFF THE BEATEN PATH: A locally produced program that features three separate segments highlighting the fun and interesting people and places in Pennsylvania. Hosts include, Jeff Bonomo, Ken Cara, Chris Fulmer.

WELLNESS THRU PHYSICAL THERAPY: Hosted by Liz Tolan, the show features a local Physical Therapist who talks about health issues that can be treated through physical therapy.

PPW, HIGH VOLTAGE: An independent wrestling show from Northeastern Pennsylvania that runs every Sunday night.

LET'S TALK CHIROPRACTIC: Locally produced show that features two Chiropractors from the Hazleton

area. Hosted by Liz Tolan along with co-hosts Dr. John Degenhart and Dr. Stacie Sando from the Degenhart Chiropractic Health Center . Guests on the show discuss health issues that were treated by Dr. Degehhart and Dr Sando.

JENTASTIC SWEETS: Hosted by Chef Jen Yamola who gives viewers a first hand lessons on baking sweet treats.

THE CHEF LOU SHOW: Hosted by Chef Lou, he gives viewers a first hand lesson at making dinner style food with an Italian flare.

WARRIOR SUMMIT OUTDOORS: It's an outdoors show that features veterans using outdoor activities to help heal the often invisible wounds of war. Hosted by Staff Sargent Erik Olson, a wounded warrior. The show began airing on June 4th.
