SCRANTON OFFICER SHOT- AN INVESTIGATION IS UNDERWAY AFTER AUTHORITIES SAY A POLICE OFFICER WAS SHOT IN SCRANTON THURSDAY MORNING.

ACCORDING TO OFFICIALS, OFFICERS WERE IN THE AREA OF HYDE PARK AVENUE TO CHECK ON REPORTS OF A POSSIBLE SHOOTING BEFORE AN OFFICER WAS STRUCK AROUND 4:30AM.

OFFICIALS SAY ONE PERSON IS IN CUSTODY AT THIS TIME, AND 19-YEAR-OLD JEREMIAH CLEVELAND IS WANTED FOR QUESTIONING.

POLICE SAY THE SHOOTING IS BELIEVED TO BE GANG-RELATED.

ANYONE WITH INFORMATION ON THE INCIDENT IS ASKED TO CALL SCRANTON POLICE AT (570) 963-3156.

THE CONDITION OF THE INJURED OFFICER IS UNKNOWN AT THIS TIME.

POLICE SAY THE OFFICER AND A SUSPECT ARE BOTH BEING TREATED AT A LOCAL TRAUMA CENTER.

ATTORNEY SENTENCED- A FORMER LACKAWANNA COUNTY ATTORNEY HAS BEEN SENTENCED TO UP TO TWENTY-THREE MONTHS IN PRISON FOR SOLICITING SEX ACTS IN EXCHANGE FOR LEGAL SERVICES.

COREY KOLCHARNO WAS SENTENCED ON THURSDAY TO A PERIOD OF FOUR TO TWENTY-THREE MONTHS IN PRISON FOLLOWED BY TWO YEARS OF PROBATION.

ACCORDING TO AN INVESTIGATION BY THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL AND PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE, KOLCHARNO HAD USED HIS POSITION TO SOLICIT SEXUAL ACTS FROM CLIENTS AND ONE CLIENT'S SISTER BETWEEN 2018 AND 2022.

OFFICIALS SAY SEVERAL OF THE WOMEN WERE STRUGGLING WITH ADDICTION OR HAD A HISTORY OF BEING SEXUALLY ABUSED.

KOLCHARNO PREVIOUSLY PLED GUILTY TO FOUR FELONY COUNTS OF PROMOTING PROSTITUTION AND WAS REQUIRED TO SURRENDER HIS LICENSE FOR PRACTICING LAW.

IN A STATEMENT, ATTORNEY GENERAL MICHELLE HENRY SAID KOLCHARNO'S ACTIONS WERE DESPEICABLE AND THAT THURSDAY'S SENTENCING HOLDS KOLCHARNO ACCOUNTABLE FOR HIS CRIMES.

HAZLETON TRAFFIC STOP ARREST- A CONVICTED PHILADELPHIA FELON WAS ARRESTED IN HAZLETON ON JANUARY 15TH.

ACCORDING TO POLICE, FREDERICK CLINKSCALES WAS INITIALLY PULLED OVER BY POLICE FOR AN EQUIPMENT VIOLATION.

HOWEVER, OFFICERS SAY THEY OBSERVED SEVERAL INDICATORS OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITY AND RECEIVED CONSENT TO CONDUCT A SEARCH OF THE VEHICLE.

DURING THE SEARCH, OFFICERS DISCOVERED FIVE BAGGIES CONTAINING SUSPECTED FENTANYL, TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS IN U.S. CURRENCY, THREE CELLPHONES, TWO HANDGUNS, MAGAZINES, AND AMMUNITION.

THE INVESTIGATION CONTINUED AT A NEARBY HOTEL WHERE A SEARCH WARRANT WAS EXECUTED AND TWENTY GRAMS OF SUSPECTED METHAMPHETAMINE AND AN ADDITIONAL FORTY-EIGHT BAGS OF SUSPECTED FENTANYL WERE SEIZED.

POLICE ALSO DISCOVERED THAT CLINKSCALES WAS A CONVICTED FELON AND NOT ALLOWED TO POSSESS FIREARMS.

CLINKSCALES HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH FIREARMS NOT TO BE CARRIED WITHOUT A LICENSE, RECEIVING STOLEN PROPERTY, POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUSBTANCE, POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA, AND POSSESSION WITH INTENT TO DELIVER A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE AMONG OTHER CHARGES.

HE WAS TRANSPORTED TO THE LUZERNE COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY ON ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLAR BAIL.

WILLIAMSPORT DOUBLE HOMICIDE- FOUR PEOPLE HAVE BEEN CHARGED IN CONNECTION WITH A DOUBLE HOMICIDE IN WILLIAMSPORT.

ACCORDING TO THE LYCOMING COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY, TROY BAILEY, MUHAMMAD DAVIS, RANDALL JOHNSON, AND SANDY PEREZ ARE ALL FACING CHARGES AFTER ALISHA SEESE AND RONALD DAILEY WERE FOUND DEAD ON JANUARY 12TH.

POLICE SAY SEESE HAD RECENTLY ENDED A RELATIONSHIP WITH BAILEY AFTER DISCOVERING THAT HE HAD SEXUALLY ASSAULTED TWO MINORS AND A WOMAN.

ACCORDING TO POLICE, BAILEY THEN PROCEEDED TO MONITOR SEESE'S WHEREABOUTS DESPITE SEESE FILING A PROTECTION FROM ABUSE ORDER AGAINST BAILEY.

ON THE EVENING OF JANUARY 11TH, POLICE SAY BAILEY AND DAVIS APPROACHED SEESE AND DAILEY'S CARS IN THE LYCOMING ENGINES PARKING LOT, ORDERED THE TWO VICTIMS TO ENTER DAILEY'S CAR, AND DROVE OFF.

AROUND 2:00 AM OFFICERS WERE DISPATCHED TO THE 600 BLOCK OF AMES PLACE FOR REPORTS OF SHOTS FIRED AND FOUND DAILEY AND SEESE DEAD WITH TWO GUNSHOT WOUNDS EACH.

BAILEY AND DAVIS HAVE BEEN CHARGED WITH FIRST-DEGREE MURDER, SECOND-DEGREE MURDER, KIDNAPPING, AND ROBBERY AMONG OTHER CHARGES.

JOHNSON HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH STALKING FOR ALLEGEDLY HELPING BAILEY TRACK SEESE'S LOCATION AND PEREZ HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH HELPING TO HIDE THE MURDER WEAPON.

WEST HAZLETON DRUG ARREST- A NINETEEN-YEAR-OLD FROM WEST HAZLETON HAS BEEN ARRESTED AFTER POLICE SAY THEY SEIZED OVER TWO THOUSAND DOSES OF FENTANYL.

DANIEL ALLEGRETTO JR WAS ARRESTED AFTER POLICE SAY THEY COMPLETED A MONTH-LONG INVESTIGATION INTO SALES OF DRUGS IN WEST HAZLETON.

DURING THE INVESTIGATION OFFICERS FOUND 2,200 DOSES OF FENTANYL, 249.6 GRAMS OF METHAMPHETAMINE, CASH USED FOR DRUG TRAFFICKING, A LARGE AMOUNT OF PACKAGING MATERIALS, AND UNLAWFULLY OWNED STEROIDS

ALLEGRETTO JR HAS BEEN CHARGED BY OFFICIALS WITH TWO COUNTS OF POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE WITH THE INTENT TO DELIVER.

HE IS CURRENTLY BEHIND BARS AT THE LUZERNE COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY ON \$125,000 BAIL.

BLOOD SHORTAGE- THE AMERICAN RED CROSS HAS DECLARED AN EMERGENCY BLOOD SHORTAGE.

IN AN ANNOUNCEMENT ON SUNDAY, RED CROSS OFFICIALS SAID THE NUMBER OF U.S. BLOOD DONORS HAD REACHED AN ALL-TIME LOW FOR THE PAST TWENTY YEARS.

ACCORDING TO THE RED CROSS, THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE DONATING BLOOD HAS FALLEN BY ABOUT FORTY PERCENT IN THE LAST TWENTY YEARS SO THAT EVEN SLIGHT DISRUPTIONS IN THE NUMBER OF DONORS CAN HAVE DRAMATIC CONSEQUENCES TO THE AVAILABILITY OF BLOOD PRODUCTS FOR PATIENTS.

IRS SCAMS- THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL IS WARNING THE PUBLIC TO BE WARY OF IRS SCAMS DURING THE TAX SEASON.

RESIDENTS ARE ASKED TO WATCH OUT FOR UNSOLICITED TEXT MESSAGES, EMAILS, AND PHONE CALLS THAT DEMAND IMMEDIATE PAYMENT OR PERSONAL INFORMATION, EVEN IF THEY APPEAR TO BE FROM THE IRS.

THE PUBLIC IS REMINDED THAT THE IRS WILL NOT INITIATE CONTACT WITH TAXPAYERS BY EMAIL, TEXT, OR PHONE CALLS AND THAT THE IRS WILL NEVER DEMAND A SPECIFIC TYPE OF PAYMENT USING CASH, CRYPTO-CURRENCY, PREPAID DEBIT CARD, GIFT CARD, OR WIRE TRANSFER.

THE IRS WILL ALSO NEVER LEAVE PRE-RECORDED OR THREATENING MESSAGES ON AN ANSWERING MACHINE OR THREATEN TO SUE OR ARREST ANYONE.

TO AVOID TAX SCAMS, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL RECOMMENDS THAT RESIDENTS FILE THEIR TAXES EARLY BEFORE SCAMMERS HAVE THE CHANCE TO FILE A FAKE TAX RETURN OR USE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION.

NESCOPECK CREEK BRIDGES PROJECT MEETING- PENNDOT AND THE BRIDGING PENNSYLVANIA DEVELOPERS HELD A PUBLIC MEETING THURSDAY EVENING TO DISCUSS PRE-CONSTRUCTION PLANS FOR THE I-80 NESCOPECK CREEK BRIDGES.

THE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT INVOLVES THE REPLACEMENT OF TWO DETERIORATING BRIDGES THAT CARRY INTERSTATE 80 EASTBOUND AND WESTBOUND OVER NESCOPECK CREEK.

PLANS INCLUDE IMPROVING THE STABILITY OF THE BRIDGES, AS WELL AS EXPANDING THE 4 FOOT LANES ON EACH BRIDGE TO 12 FOOT LANES OF TRAFFIC IN EACH DIRECTION.

THE BUDGET PRIORITIZES SHAPIRO'S "GET STUFF DONE" APPROACH BY INVESTING IN SECTORS INCLUDING PUBLIC EDUCATION, LAW ENFORCEMENT, AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.
