HAZLETON SHOOTING- VICTOR PEREZ, FORMER PRESIDENT OF LA CASA DOMINICANA DE HAZLETON HAS BEEN ARRESTED IN CONNECTION WITH A WEDNESDAY EVENING SHOOTING IN HAZLETON.

ACCORDING TO HAZLETON CITY POLICE, PEREZ CONFRONTED THE VICTIM IN THE 140 BLOCK OF SOUTH VINE STREET.

DURING THE CONFRONTATION, POLICE SAY PEREZ FIRED SEVERAL SHOTS AT THE VICTIM, STRIKING THEM IN THE ARM.

INVESTIGATORS SAY PEREZ THEN FLED THE SCENE BUT WAS APPREHENDED SHORTLY AFTERWARD AT HIS RESIDENCE.

PEREZ HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT WITH A DEADLY WEAPON, AND RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING ANOTHER PERSON.

PEREZ WAS TRANSPORTED TO THE LUZERNE COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, UNABLE TO POST HIS FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLAR STRAIGHT CASH BAIL.

IN RESPONSE TO THE SHOOTING, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AT LA CASA DOMINICANA DE HAZLETON HELD AN EMERGENCY MEETING ON WEDNESDAY AND APPOINTED ROBERT COLLADO AS THE NEW INTERIM PRESIDENT OF THE ORGANIZATION.

IN A PUBLIC STATEMENT ON THEIR FACEBOOK PAGE, LA CASA DOMINICANA DE HAZLETON ANNOUNCED THAT THE ORGANIZATION APOLIGIZES FOR THE ACTIONS OF CRUZ AND HIS ACTIONS DO REFLECT THE VALUES OF LA CASA DOMINICANA DE HAZLETON. AND THAT THIS WAS NOT AN ISOLATED ISSUE BETWEEN THEM AND THE MAGAZINE. THEY ALSO ANNOUNCED WILL REMAIN OPEN DURING NORMAL BUSINESS

HOURS BUT THAT THEY ARE DECLINING COMMENT TO MEMBERS OF THE MEDIA AT THIS TIME.

HAZLETON STABBING- HAZLETON CITY POLICE HAVE IDENTIFIED THE SUSPECT IN A STABBING THAT TOOK PLACE YESTERDAY IN THE AREA OF ALTER STREET AND WEST 4TH STREET.

EDGAR FORTUNATO IS THE MALE SUSPECTED OF STABBING THE VICTIM. OFFICERS RESPONDED TO THE AREA AROUND 2PM FOR A REPORT OF A STABBING VICTIM. OFFICERS WERE ABLE TO LOCATE THE VICTIM, WHO HAD MULTIBLE STAB WOUNDS AT THE SCENE.

THE VICTIM WAS LIFE FLIGHTED TO A LOCAL TRAUMA CENTER FOR LIFE THREATENING INJURIES. FORTUNATO WAS RELEASED FROM LEHIGH VALLEY HOSPITAL-HAZLETON WITH NON-LIFE THREATENING LACERATIONS TO HIS HANDS.

FORTUNATO IS CHARGED ON ONE COUNT OF AGGRAVATED ASSAULT WITH A DEADLY WEAPON, ONE COUNT OF RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING ANOTHER PERSON, ONE COUNT OF SIMPLE ASSAULT, AND ONE COUNT OF HARRASSMENT.

FORTUNATO IS CURENTLY BEING HELD AT THE LUZERNE COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, UNABLE TO POST HIS \$100,000 BAIL.

JAMES DIXON. SANCHEZ, OLIVER, AND ELIZABETH GONZALEZ WERE ALL DENIED BAIL, WHILE KINNEY AND VALENTIN-GONZALEZ WERE BOTH GIVEN \$100,000 STRAIGHT BAIL.

OFFICERS SAY THEY RECEIVED A 9-1-1 CALL ABOUT A STABBING VICTIM IN THE AREA OF GRANT STREET AND WEST 6TH STREET AROUND 2:00 AM ON SUNDAY DECEMBER 4TH.

FOLLOWING AN INVESTIGATION, POLICE DETERMINED THAT DIEGO TAVERAS-CORONA HAD ALLEGEDLY ENTERED THE VICTIM'S HOME THROUGH AN UNLOCKED DOOR.

TAVERAS-CORONA HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, RECKLESSLY ENDANGERING ANOTHER PERSON, TERRORISTIC THREATS, AND SIMPLE ASSAULT.

HE IS CURRENTLY BEHIND BARS AT THE LUZERNE COUNTY CORRECTIONAL FACILITY AND HAS BEEN DENIED BAIL.

WILLIAMS IS CURRENTLY BEHIND BARS AT THE COLUMBIA COUNTY PRISON ON \$250,000 BAIL.
