

KIKZ QUARTERLY ISSUES/PROGRAM STATEMENT

Second Quarter 2023, Dated 6-30-23

1. Interviews are offered to be broadcast for the interest and information of the general public, at the request and approval of the management.
2. Local and Area News program is broadcast three times daily, Monday through Friday, at 7:20 a.m., 12:15 p.m., and 5:05 p.m., including reports and public service announcements from governmental entities (city, county, school, hospital, etc.) and includes local organizational meetings, police and sheriff news, non-profit organization news, local obituaries, and area news of local interest.
3. "Dial-A-Trade" program is offered each Monday-Friday, beginning at 9:05 a.m., allowing persons to call in at no charge to sell non-business items, wanted items, garage sales, lost and found, and items to give away.
4. Local weather forecasts are aired each hour from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Saturday from the National Weather Service, with two complete weather news segments each day. State weather forecasts are aired four times per day, along with "Skywarn" project publicity. Severe weather is announced immediately when necessary.
5. State and national network newscasts are aired each hour.
6. Adult Contemporary Music is offered for the entertainment of listeners 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
7. "Birthday Club" is aired each day, Monday through Friday, when persons can call in birthdays or anniversaries for that day.
8. Broadcast of public service announcements, both local and national, daily during regular programming.
9. Broadcast of popular programs such as "The Sound of Texas", "Passport to Texas", "Focus on the Family", and the "Schlafly Report" Monday through Friday.
10. Broadcast of the results of the City Council and School Board Elections.
11. German language program, with German music and religious programming, broadcast Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, from 5:30-7:30 p.m., and Saturday from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m., to serve German speaking population.
12. Broadcast of a weekly "DocTalk" Program, featuring local hospital medical staff being interviewed and taking public questions on medical issues.
13. Many daily public service announcements for governmental entities on all issues regarding the Covid-19 Pandemic.
14. Informing the public about health issues in the community, including Covid-19.
15. Public service announcements for local healthcare institutions regarding the Covid-19 Pandemic.
16. Broadcast once per week of Hometown Pride Program, highlighting activities in public schools in Seminole and Denver City, Texas.
17. Weekly airing of an "Ask the Mayor" Program, to keep the general public informed on City of Seminole activities, allowing the general public to directly ask questions of the Mayor.
