Wendlee Broadcasting has 8 full time employees and 2 part time employees scheduled for less than 30 hours per week. Of those persons on staff, 4 1961are female and one of those is in a supervisor role. Of the 8 full-time staff, 4 are females and 4 are males. One female is Native American, one is Mexican-American. One part time female employee was elevated to full time as she increased work hours.
