<u><i>Subject</i></u>	<u><i>Description of Issue of Concern</i></u>
1. <b>Community Involvement</b>	[Non-profit and community organizations provide information and free services for the public. The station utilizes its public program to provide a voice for those issues
2. <b>Financial</b>	A nation that is pulling out of a severe recession needs information on jobs, financial planning and housing. Each week, the public affairs programming includes a segment on these
3. <b>Health</b>	When asked by the news and public affairs director which issue ranked highest for listeners of the station, Health topped the list of concerns for consumers.
4. <b>Teens &amp; Self Esteem</b>	During call-ins to our live shows, many teens have voiced frustration in being heard on topics of interest to them. The summer of police shootings involving teens also prompted several segments this quarter
5. <b>Education</b>	Educational options and cost for improving one's abilities was a top concern for an aging demographic. Many were concerned that a slow economy could lead to job loss—and they wanted to increase skills that could lead to better jobs
6. <b>Politics &amp; Law</b>	The decision by N.C. legislature to change guidelines for voting and laws that would impact citizens from taxes to business development prompted more shows on these two hot topics
