Topics:

- Mr. Kelly's writing credentials and most recent article, *Humanizing the Enslaved of Fort Monroe's Arc of Freedom*, which chronicles role of slave labour in the construction of Fort Monroe
- The two-year duration of the research project, aided by documents and records found at the Philadelphia Archive
- The surprisingly highly skilled jobs with which slaves were tasked, such as masonry and stone cutting
- The role the project has played in genealogical research for local descendants of the slave workers as the Fort Monroe construction job kept records of all its workers while the federal government kept no records of African-American citizens prior to 1870

- Efforts being made in the industry for "clean coal" - means by which to utilize its energy with net zero carbon emissions

- The U.S.'s current status as the leading producer of oil and natural gas
