- **1. THE ARTS:** Local arts activities in the New Year with Center for the Arts Director Patience Long (1/4/22).
- **2. HOMELESS:** Murfreesboro continues to see dramatic increases in the homeless population. On Jan. 3, 2023, Scott interviews numerous homeless persons to help the community get a better awareness of this population's concerns, needs and prevalence of mental illness.
- **3. EMERGENCY RESPONDERS (fire, police, paramedics):** On Jan. 4, 2023 Murfreesboro Police Chief Michael Bowen gave the previous year's crime statistics and discussed efforts to reduce crime in the coming year. A focus on the duties of RCSO's SRO program on /18/2023. 2/1/2023 is about winter driving and the impact ice and snow have on safety issues.
- **4. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR COURTS:** District Attorney General Jennings Jones and ADA J. Paul Newman analyze the court dockets and interact with the public on cold cases and laws. 1/6/2023). 1/12/2023 Attorney Brandon Bass talks about what to do if you're in a vehicle crash. Attorney John Day talks about what to do if you are involved with a traffic crash with an 18-wheeler.

Westlawn opens Monday week. 3-time cancer survivor Colon Sheets and physicians discuss how this 16-year-old is fighting the disease and keep a 3.0 grade average while doing it. 2/14/2023 Cardiologist Dr. Clemmons tells about a major expansion at Ascension St. Thomas that will dramatically increase the numbers and types of heart procedures that they can do. 2/23/2023 increases in cardiac issues for senior citizens and new programs being developed at the local hospital.
- **6. HISTORY** (**topic with largest following in county**): 1/2/2023 former State Rep. John Hood talked about the radio station's milestone 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. As one of the station's early employees, he reminisced about the 40s on WGNS. 3/22/2023 historian Gloria Christy talks about the life of Uncle Dave Macon, the first Grand Ole Opry Superstar (from Rutherford County).
- **7. Tennessee's 113<sup>th</sup> General Assembly**: 1/13/2023 State Rep. Mike Sparks talks about issues that have come on the table during the first 4-days. Listener questions how parents can use state funds on private schools without dropping funding for public schools. 3/29/2023 County Mayor Joe Carr discusses the General Assembly's down vote of allowing counties to have a Development Tax.
- **8. SENIOR CITIZENS:** Senior care varies with each individual and an audience input segment helps the community to better understand how to stay fit and live healthier lives (3/31/2023).
