Issue: US Foreign Policy & Results in Libya 10 years Later: Special guest: Gregory Shupak, teaches English and Media Studies at the University of Guelph-Humber in Toronto Canada and author of the book The Wrong Story: Palestine, Israel, and the Media, published by OR Books. He has published a number of articles that can be found at publications like Fairness and Accuracy in Reporting, Jacobin, In These Times, and Electronic Intifada.

In 2010, the year before the June 2011 US led and illegal NATO overthrow of the Libyan government, Libya had the highest Human Development Index (HDI) of the 54 nations of Africa. It provided the best quality of life for its majority population compared to all other African nations. Tonight's show details the Obama administration, along with other international power-structure leading nations such as France led, false claims that spearheaded the illegal overthrow of the Libyan government. We examine the veracity and lack of veracity of objective claims made versus the reality on the ground to seek to determine what was the 'primary motive' for such a devastating reversal of quality of life for the majority population of 6 million Libyans. This reversal has occurred during the last ten years since Libya has deteriorated into constant war by a host of proxy nations. and has become, **a safe haven for terrorist groups** and has seen a **return of slavery** and the selling of slaves.

Our guest details the contents of two articles he has published on Libya. The listener will be afforded a mountain of evidence suggesting the real humanitarian threat to the Libyan people was not their own government but instead the same interests and parties that turned Iraq, and Yemen into humanitarian holocausts through sanctions, and western led military interventionism. Did Libya regime change have to occur because of humanitarian concerns, or because they led Pan Africanism, the promoted unification of African nations to protect the African continent from unrestricted profiteering investments that have continue to rob and impoverish Africa people of their mineral resources through colonialism and now neocolonialism? If so, what proof is offered.

Issue: From Here to Equality: Reparations for Black Americans in the Twenty-First Century – A Book Review: Special Guests and co authors, Dr William A. Darity Jr., & A. Kirsten Mullen, of **From Here to Equality: Reparations for Black Americans in the Twenty-First Century** share the highlights of their recently published book. William

A. Darity Jr. is the Samuel DuBois Cook Professor of Public Policy, African and African American Studies, and Economics at Duke University. A. Kirsten Mullen is a writer, folklorist, museum consultant, and lecturer whose work focuses on race, art, history, and politics.

Their research insights into President Lincoln's evolving understanding of what should and could be done to abolish Slavery are highlighted including his efforts through 1865 to try to get the Southern traders to agree to a system of 'emancipated compensation'. How MD stayed with the Union and if they had not how DC would have been totally encircled by Confederate insurgents. How much more costly it was to execute the Civil War than to have executed a compensated emancipation program had been adopted by the Southern States that ultimately seceded from the US. The 13 amendment and black codes are addressed and accordingly the criminalizing and continued dehumanizing of Afro Americans which simply just took new forms such as and compelling them to occupy the most dangerous jobs post 'emancipation'.

As described in their book review, "Racism and discrimination have choked economic opportunity for African Americans at nearly every turn. At several historic moments, the trajectory of racial inequality could have been altered dramatically. Perhaps no moment was more opportune than the early days of Reconstruction, when the U.S. government temporarily implemented a major redistribution of land from former slaveholders to the newly emancipated enslaved. But neither Reconstruction nor the New Deal nor the civil rights struggle led to an economically just and fair nation. Today, systematic inequality persists in the form of housing discrimination, unequal education, police brutality, mass incarceration, employment discrimination, and massive wealth and opportunity gaps. Economic data indicates that for every dollar the average white household holds in wealth the average black household possesses a mere ten cents."

Issue: Media Bias & its Complicity with US Foreign Policy: Special guest: Mike Whitney investigative journalist discusses the Media Bias that has failed to properly vet our foreign policy and some candidates while harassing others. We provide a CNN 7/31/20 Anderson Cooper interview with the only antiwar candidate of substance, Tulsi Gabbards following the second round of democratic debates on 7/31/20 in Detroit. While Gabbards is badgered by Cooper, based on unsupported 'Assad apologist' comments made by Kamala Harris, during Cooper's post-debate 7/31/20 interviews, Cooper gives Harris free pass treatment regarding Gabbards' wide ranging debate claims against her on a host of issues regarding CJS positions and unequal justice. Harris avoided responding to the specific charges during the debate that were laid out by Gabbards. Then, again when questioned by Cooper following the debate, she refused to answer the charges, instead her tact, which went unchallenged by Cooper, was to completely change the subject accusing Gabbards of being an Assad apologist.

Later during the same post-debate interview with Gabbords, Cooper incessantly, following the influence of Harris avoidance strategy, i.e., the "Assad apologist" meme, focused his attention on whether Gabbords thought Assad was a dictator, rather than the 'real news reality' that Gabbords shared and documented, namely that we are, and have been, supporting the same al Qaeda terrorists in Syria that attacked us on 9/11. Instead of Cooper turning the attention of this monumental crime into his focus, he essentially not only avoided it but minimized it by saying it sounded like an 'Assad talking point'. These two examples of Harris deflecting accountability for her positions, and being allowed to do so by Cooper, by shifting focus to unsubstantiated accusations that Gabbords is an 'Assad apologist' rather than the substance of Gabbards claims against Harris, that went unanswered reflects the traitorship of our MSM. Instead of demanding answers from Harris, and instead of pursuing the real story of US complicity with terrorism, Cooper showed where his real loyalties lie, to the status quo, and a criminal foreign policy in bed with terrorism, rather than the hard truths Gabbords was revealing. In the end, he too basically accused Gabbords as being an Assad apologist.

Another MSM example of its real character is revealed by how accusations by both Joe Biden and Kamala Harris, which were made during the Presidential and VP debates when both reasserted the Russian bounty allegations despite it never being supported by any evidence made public. Instead, it was contradicted by Pentagon and military figures as unproven. During the backdrop of our media failing basic principles associated with due process in pursuing the truth, our guest evaluates both Kamala Harris and Tulsi Gabbords as viable candidates based on their public positions. We also discuss the role of media, including social media in failing to bring important major contradictions needed to the public for needed but absent scrutiny.

Issue: Give me a Dollar & I will Give you 60 Cents! (a clear example of one tool of oppression of a predatory system that has accelerated increasing US wealth inequality):
 Special guest: BLID archive of Alicia Hansen (2008) staff writer, webmaster and copy editor at the Tax Foundation and has written two extensive studies of the tax policy implications of state run lotteries and her work has appeared in major newspapers and journals and has testified before the Vermont Legislature.

Tonight's show is on the lottery as a form of oppression. Listening to the 10/22/20 presidential debate last week it was disappointing but revealing first, in that both candidates and both parties offer the American public much of the same. They both promoted increased wealth inequality, occurring under both the 8-year Democratic administration of Obama-Biden and the last four years of Republican Trump administration. And secondly in that they both claimed convincingly how corrupt the other was. For the independent investigator who is unafraid of actively pursuing the truth, the sentiment of their accusations rings true and it is the system itself and the behaviors it allows and/or fails to prosecute that is the root of the problem. It is that truth that the American public must recognize and correct before we can become the great country, we have the potential to become.

We must end the blatant forms and multi-layered oppression that the elites of each political party (i.e. 'duopoly') has benefitted from and that has resulted in such wealth inequality exaggerations. These rates of wealth inequality have become exacerbated to its greatest degrees when you examine the disparities of wealth and quality of life by race. Hence the term 'systemic racism'. Layers of systemic oppression are numerous and the layer we study tonight is regressive taxation through the lottery.

Learn how the lottery is best described as a predatory process that essentially results in the 'poor', low-income taxpayers, paying a disproportionate share of the tax burden, while middle- and high-income taxpayers shoulder a relatively small tax burden. The result is a further widening of the oppressive wealth inequality of our nation. We will show how the lottery is not economically neutral and is a hidden tax and its hidden nature reveals the absence of transparency. It is a form of gambling with the poorest rates of return and it is desperate attempt to make ends meet, engaged in disproportionately by those who can least afford the overall loss of their meager savings.

The show includes excerpts from a 2008 BLID show on the lottery and weaves in current 2020 analysis confirming and authenticating the 2008 show content and conclusions. Join us in revealing the deceit and predatory nature of the lottery.

Issue: Corporate Profiteering & 500K Dead, Oxy/Opiate Crisis & Nobody goes to Jail (another result of oppression of a predatory system): Special guest: Kirsten Mayer (2008) Attorney with Ropes & Gray, Boston, Massachusetts

Tonight's show is on when medical care conflicts with Pharma corporate bottom lines, as a form of oppression. Oxycontin, Corporate Criminal Law and the Public Welfare, with guest and attorney, Kirsten Mayer who explains recent Supreme Court decisions that paved the way for prosecution of executives who were removed from the activity of the criminal behavior (i.e. the misbranding and its results of an explosion of opiate misuse that led to addiction and 500k deaths over the next two decades). As a consequence the prosecution of Purdue Frederick in 2007 along with "its top three executives, pleaded guilty as individuals to misbranding charges, a criminal violation and agreed to pay a total of US\$34.5 million in fines as part of a \$634m judgment.

It is a story that as we speak today (11/2/20 BLID show) has resulted in 500K deaths, 2x the amount of the COVID 19 pandemic (albeit over a longer period of time). When 'corporate profits' dwarf the well-being of the majority population with respect to which is the greater priority. The majority lose and they lose badly.

Tonight, we discuss Purdue Frederick's role in the Opioid epidemic sweeping our nation over the last 25 years and includes substantial portions of an 4/17/2008 show featuring

Attorney Kirsten Mayer. The \$634m judgment appears to be significant until you examine what the GAO noticed, that in 2001 alone Purdue generated \$1.3B in sales.

This judgment was followed by others and then most recently an October 2020, Purdue Pharma agreed to plead guilty to three criminal charges and pay \$8.3B in fines and damages. The company admitted to bribing doctors to unnecessarily prescribe OxyContin and to lying to the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) about controls on sales of the painkiller. It also paid illegal kickbacks to a health records company to promote opioid prescribing to physicians according to a 10/20/20 Guardian article.

“Purdue deeply regrets and accepts responsibility for the misconduct,” said the chairman of its board, Steve Miller. Meanwhile, reportedly the Sackler family received some \$10B in payments over the years.
