All of Zone A is under a mandatory evacuation order. That generally includes islands and coastal areas such as Fort Myers Beach, Bonita Beach, etc A part of Zone B south of Veterans Parkway in Cape Coral is also under mandatory evacuation. People who live in mobile homes and manufactured homes are also part of the evacuation order. Multiple shelters are now opened. They are: Dunbar High School, East Lee County High School, Estero Recreation Center, Gateway High School, Hertz Arena, Island Coast High School, Oak Hammock Middle School and Veterans Park Recreation Center. Hurricane Ian's maximum winds have increased to 125 mph, making it a Category 3 storm. It is moving north at 12 mph as it continues to strengthen. Hurricane-force winds extend out to 35 miles from Ian's center and tropical-storm-force winds to 115 miles from the storm's core. A turn to the north-northeast in the direction of Southwest Florida and a reduction in Ian's speed is expected tonight and Wednesday. Please be safe and take all the necessary steps to do so.

Hurricane lan	Local News Break	Sep 27	8:30 pm	60 seconds	Ian is currently just over one hundred miles southwest of Naples, it's eye above the Dry Tortugas. And moving at about ten miles per hour. The strongest wind the storm has been able to produce held at one hundred and twenty miles per hour but could rise as high as one-thirty or a Category Four hurricane. Storm trackers are suggesting Ian may make landfall at full power rather than weakening as initially predicted. If you have been given advice or warnings by local authorities its strongly recommended that you follow it. Hurricane Ian may end up being very dangerous. Storm surge warnings are in effect from naples to Sarasota. And that surge could reach as high as twelve feet. Florida Power and Light have already deployed sixteen thousand crew members at staging areas throughout the state, and they say they are ready to make repairs and respond to all outages as long as it remains safe for their people to do so. They may have to take shelter for a few hours during the worst of the storm though. Much of the state is expected to deal with at least tropical storm winds and the possibility of flooding as well as tornadoes spawned by ian at least until Thursday if the storm retains its strength.

The National Hurricane Center says Ian is 65 miles WSW of Naples with maximum sustained winds of 155 MPH, very near a Category 5 storm. The storm is moving NNE at 9 MPH. A hurricane warning is in effect. Landfall is expected this afternoon between Tampa and Ft. Myers. While the National Hurricane Center is warning that Hurricane Ian's winds will be catastrophic, it is also concerned about the storm's rainfall and storm surge. Forecasters now project a storm surge of 12 to 16 feet will strike the coast from Englewood to Bonita Beach. The National Hurricane Center also projects that 12 to 18 inches of rain could fall in a swath along Interstate 4. Here's a reminder of available shelters: Dunbar High School, East Lee County High School, Estero Recreation Center, Gateway High School, Hertz Arena, Island Coast High School, Oak Hammock Middle School, South Fort Myers High School, Varsity Lakes Middle School and Veterans Park Recreation Center. Please be safe and take the necessary precautions to do so.

Cape Coral's mayor says this could be catastrophic to the area. Rainfall could also be anywhere between 12-24 inches. Airports in the area are closed. Stay safe.
