More than 4-million teenagers are homeless every year, though not always by choice. “Whether it’s that they don’t feel safe in their own home, or whether they’ve been kicked out, this is not something young people generally want.” Whatever drove them to the streets, hunger inevitably awaits. Matthew Belwood knows how that feels. At 16, Matt lost most of hearing and now, as the National Director of Youth for Christ's Deaf Teen Quest, his heart is for young people to know their worth in Christ. Matt says growing up, his church youth group surrounded him with love, but when they explained his deafness to others, it felt like they were saying, "He's awesome, but he has something that may be a little bit broken inside of him...these great people that are really trying to help me and protect me and love me and cherish me in my youth group kind of planted the seed inside my head that ' he's amazing, except for one thing.'" Matt emphasizes that the deaf teen isn't broken, but part of the body of Christ with great potential. Often deaf teens feel disconnected and alone during a time when there are so many mental, emotional and spiritual changes going on. More than 80 percent of deaf and hard-of-hearing teens don't have a parent who can sign or communicate with them in a direct way. Matt says with Deaf Teen Quest, "caring Christian adults</p>

While those efforts are still underway, the Army Corps of engineers is working on restoring clean water to all of Lee County and a temporary bridge is being set up for Pine Island by the department of transportation, that bridge is expected to be completed by the end of the week; and will make getting much needed supplies to the area much easier. Over half a million people are still without power, several hundred healthcare facilities have had their power restored...full power restoration across the state may not happen until later in the week. If you are in need of food and or water though, M-R-Es and bottled water are being distributed at Muscle Car City, Charlotte Sports Park and the Ann Denver Regional Park in Charlotte County While Lee County has The Old Bonita Springs, Kelly Road Soccer Complex, and the Cape Coral Sports Complex as distribution sites. Some gas stations, grocery stores and hardware stores are re-opening, along with drug stores like CVS and Walgreens. Please know they are working with limited crews and limited inventory.</p> <p>Florida Baptist Disaster Relief is opening nine kitchen and response sites today. They are:</p> <p>McGregor Baptist Church, Riverside Baptist and Crossroads Baptist Church in Ft. Myers.</p> <p>New Hope Baptist in Cape Coral</p> <p>Murdock Baptist in Port Charlotte</p> <p>First Baptist in Wauchula, Venice and Naples</p> <p>And Calvary Baptist in Arcadia</p> <p>There they plan to offer free meals and they expect to make up to 160 thousand per day, to help you and area residents. SW Florida International Airport is expected to open tomorrow for limited commercial flight operation. Verizon is offering free charging stations and Internet access in Port Charlotte and Fort Myers, regardless of your carrier. In Port Charlotte it's at the Town Center Mall; in Ft. Sanibel is issuing re-entry passes at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Fort Myers from 8am - 5pm Monday through Saturday. A free veterinary clinic is open daily from 9am - 5pm in Fort Myers at Terry Park. Tomorrow from 1230 - 230 you can pick up fresh juices, snacks and packaged sandwiches from the school district office in Fort Myers. The Salvation Army of Collier County is providing 2,000 meals every day. The Harry Chapin Food Bank is delivering food to the Lee County Civic Center in North Fort Myers. Governor DeSantis is going to survey the state tomorrow, he says this will help him determine the best steps to take over the next few days and coming weeks as recovery continues. If you still need emergency shelter, South Fort Myers high, Hertz Arena, and the Estero Rec Center have beds available. Power restoration for Florida is still expected to be around the end of the week, which will help provide some much needed relief. Lee County is still under a boil water advisory, if you can't boil water because you still don't have power, it's really recommended that you either purify your water or stick with bottled water, due to contamination. The Blue Roof program is now available for those who saw some damage to their roofs due to the hurricane. The program is being run by the Army Corps of Engineers who will be able to provide temporary roofing, free of charge. The deadline to get signed up for it is the twenty first this month. It is still forecast to become a Category 1 Hurricane as it moves across the NW Bahamas today and is expected to make landfall along the East coast of Florida tonight. Expect heavy rain, flooding and gusty winds. Tri-Rail and Brightline in South Florida are going to suspend services ahead of the storm. Many school districts have canceled classes today and tomorrow. Three Florida counties, Flagler, Palm Beach and Volusia, have been ordered to evacuate from barrier islands, low-lying areas and mobile homes. To check your evacuation zone, visit pbcgov.com. New warnings and watches were issued for many parts of Florida, including the southwestern Gulf coastline, which was devastated by Hurricane Ian in September. Nicole is a large tropical storm. Tropical-storm-force winds extend 460 miles, especially to the north of the center of circulation.</p> <p>Please be safe.</p>
