Tire Quarter 2016

Following is a list of the treatment of the issues ascertained by WPRO-AM and WEAN-FM, as the most important to our listening community. The list of programs includes the three month period ending SEPTEMBER, 2016 and is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority of significance.

THE NEWS WITH GENE VALICENTI

A three hour news, information and talk program that airs from 6 am – 9 am Monday -Friday, and is hosted by Gene Valicenti. News updates four times an hour with Bill Haberman, weather updates with Elliot Abrams of the "Accuweather" weather reporting service, and traffic updates with Vic Edwards four times an hour.

THE JOHN DEPETRO SHOW

A three hour talk program that focuses on local and national news stories. John interviews local and national leaders about issues that affect the community. The John DePetro Show airs Monday – Friday, from 9 am – Noon.

THE MATT ALLEN SHOW

A three hour program that focuses on local and national issues affecting the community. It features interview with local political and community leaders. The Matt Allen Show airs Monday through Friday, Noon – 3 PM.

THE DAN YORKE SHOW

A three hour talk program that addresses issues of local, national, and international importance. The program features live interviews and interaction with the listening audience, and frequently broadcasts live on location to address issues in a particular community. The Dan Yorke Show airs Monday through Friday from 3 pm – 6 pm.

THE TARA GRANAHAN SHOW

A three hour program that focuses on local and national issues affecting the community. It features interview with local political and community leaders. The Tara Granahan Show airs Monday through Friday, 6PM – 9PM.

AMAZING WOMEN

A 30-minute talk program hosted by Deb Reggeiro focusing exclusively on women's issues, interviewing notable women in the community. Amazing Women airs Sundays from 8:30 am – 9 am.

CUMULUS COMMUNITY

A 30-minute interview program hosted by WPRO News Anchor Bill Haberman focusing on Rhode Island issues. Bill interviews notable newsmakers in the community. Cumulus Community airs Sundays from 8 am – 9:30 am.

NEWS COVERAGE

WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM Radio airs local news beginning at 5 am and continuing through 8 pm Monday through Friday. Saturdays, local news reports air between 6 am and 6 pm. On Sundays, local news reports run between 8 am and 11 am on days when there is no New England Patriots broadcast.

WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM Radio provides comprehensive coverage of all local, state and national elections and primaries including discussions with candidates along with a review of platforms, polls and community impact of each case.

The format of WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM is news/talk. Programs on WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM usually involve discussions of more than one subject per day and often vary from program to program. The following is a list of programs and coverage of issues ascertained from the community for the period ending SEPTEMBER 30, 2016.

Issues Ascertained by WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM as Important to the listening Community:

Economy/Jobs – The shows discussed issues that impact the Greater Providence area's economy, including unemployment, taxation, retirement plans and casino issues.

Housing/Homelessness – The shows discussed numbers for housing, including realty business numbers, and issues that affect the homeless population of the metropolitan area.

Education – The programs covered issues relating to test scores as well as staffing issues in the schools in the Greater Providence area.

Healthcare - WPRO-AM/WEAN-FM's programs focused on the health and well being of it's residents, as well as ways to prevent dangerous situations.

Children's Issues - The shows covered issues relating to the Greater Providence area's youth's well being and keeping them out of crime.
