A person is in custody following a police pursuit in Allegheny County. The chase began in McKees Rocks yesterday when authorities tried to pull over Devaughn Echols. The chase ended when Echols reportedly crashed into some parked cars on Woodward Avenue then tried to run away.

Cleanup continues today in the Midwest following last week's historic storms. Flood waters on the Mississippi River are moving downstream after cresting at record levels below St. Louis. The river hit the highest flood level ever at Cape Girardeau [jer-AR-doh ], Missouri over the weekend.

President Obama is starting his final year in office by working to tighten the nation's gun laws. The President will meet with Attorney General Loretta Lynch today to finalize new executive actions.

Hidden Valley Resort is closed due to the lack of snow. The resort's website says it's only had three inches of natural snow this year. A cold snap before Christmas allowed crews to make snow, but unusually warm temperatures melted it. A few slopes are still open at the nearby Seven Springs Mountain Resort.

Seven firefighters are recovering after rescuing an elderly Wilkinsburg woman from a house fire. The fire happened around 9 a.m. on Friday. Several of the firefighters had to jump out of second and third floor windows to escape the flames. The woman and a few of the firefighters are still hospitalized, but none with life-threatening injuries.

Minimum wage workers in 14 states are getting a pay raise. States with new laws creating higher minimum wages in 2016 are Alaska, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska, New York, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, and West Virginia.

"Star Wars: The Force Awakens" is in line to become the highest-grossing film in history as it leads the box office for the third straight week. The seventh film in the franchise took in over 88-million-dollars over New Year's weekend and it's now grossed over 740-million-bucks domestically.

A possible trade agreement between Philadelphia and companies from China is receiving criticism from

Pittsburgh Mayor Bill Peduto. Peduto says the Trans-Pacific Partnership would do harm to Pennsylvania's steel industry. Outgoing Philadelphia Mayor Michael Nutter has been lobbying President Obama to get a deal done because it will bring his city higher-paying jobs.

GOP House Speaker Paul Ryan is slamming President Obama's expected executive actions on gun control. Ryan accuses the President of being dismissive toward Americans who value the 2nd Amendment.

A area school is going to be closed today. According to the Woodland Hills School District website, the Junior/Senior High School Campus will be closed due to a water main break. All other schools will be open. All staff must report at the normal times.

The Allegheny County District Attorney's Office is blocking an elected official from taking office. Corey Sanders was elected to the McKeesport City Council in November, but now the DA is saying he cannot hold public office. Sanders was convicted of drug charges in 1993 and spent four-years in prison. This makes him ineligible to take office until he gets pardoned from the governor.

General Motors is investing 500-million dollars in Lyft to develop a network of self-driving cars. The automaker and the ride-sharing service announced the partnership Monday. The deal is part of a one billion-dollar fundraising round, which also includes investors from Saudi Arabia, China and Japan.

One of southwestern Pennsylvania's major ski resorts is making snow again. Seven Springs Mountain Resort was limited in its snow-making because of the unusually warm December. A spokesperson says colder temperatures now are allowing them to make snow again. As long as temperatures are 28 degrees or less, the resort will be making snow.

The number of drug overdose deaths in Allegheny County in 2015 is likely to surpass the previous record. Through December 1st, there were 304 deadly overdoses, just four less than in all of 2014. It could be weeks before the 2015 numbers are finalized pending the results of toxicology tests in several cases. The medical examiner's office says the leading cause of overdose deaths was heroin.

A man is dead after he ran his car off the road and drove into an electronic street sign in Washington County. He was identified as Bryan Harrison from Eighty Four. Harrison was driving on Thomas

Eighty Four Road at the time of the incident. He was reportedly not wearing a seatbelt.

President Obama says anybody who does business selling firearms needs to get a license and conduct background checks. Obama laid out several new executive actions on guns yesterday.

The United Nations Security Council is calling an emergency session today over reports that North Korea has tested a hydrogen bomb. North Korea says it successfully tested a miniaturized nuclear device early today.

A suspect on Allegheny County's most-wanted list is now in custody. He was arrested by sheriff's deputies Tuesday morning in the South Side Slopes. Robert Pfoertner of Mount Oliver was wanted for bail forfeiture for failing to appear at his November arraignment on theft charges.

A man is huff after crashing into several vehicles in Washington. Joseph Boone was at Washington Hospital when he reportedly checked himself out, stole a truck then crashed into at least three cars near Walnut Avenue, yesterday afternoon. Boone was taken back to the hospital with unspecified injuries.

More tropical diseases are on the way to the United States. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says climate change and more people traveling to tropical countries have a lot to do with diseases never seen in the U.S. being on a path to arrive here.

A new study says smaller families are better for kids. Three economists researched 26 years of data on parents and children. They concluded that as more children are born into a family, the other children are more likely to have more behavior problems, lower learning abilities, and worse outcomes later in life.

Police are looking for a man accused of fracturing the ribs of his two-month old daughter. Billy Damond Williams is wanted on charges including attempted homicide, aggravated assault, endangering the welfare of children and recklessly endangering another person.

Braddock Mayor John Fetterman is asking the governor to pardon McKeesport Councilman-elect Corey Sanders' drug conviction because it is keeping him from taking office. Mayor Fetterman, a Senate candidate, says a drug conviction that happened over 20 years ago should not stop a person from taking office if they were elected by the people.

Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump is aiming "birth" claims at rival Ted Cruz. The Texas Senator was born in Canada to an American mother. Trump told the "Washington Post" that the subject of Cruz's birthplace could end up getting tied up in court cases for years.

The next Powerball jackpot winner will come into close to half-a-billion dollars, or more. No winners in last night's Powerball drawing means a record 675 million dollars is up for grabs Saturday night.

President Obama talks about his new gun control initiatives tonight in a town hall meeting on CNN. White House spokesman Josh Earnest says the President hopes the event will kickstart a constructive, national conversation about gun violence.

The burrito chain says the subpoena is connected to a criminal investigation into an "isolated norovirus incident" at a Simi Valley restaurant last August.

All of the Sincerely Yogurt shops have a new owner. Ablak Holdings, which owns Vocelli Pizza, says it bought the yogurt franchise. Sincerely Yogurt has 23 locations. Ablak says it hopes to grow that number locally and throughout the country and even internationally.

A fire is under investigation in Pittsburgh's Brighton Heights neighborhood. The fire started yesterday morning. Everyone inside the building was able to make it out safely.

A Pennsylvania State Police officer is facing indecent exposure charges. Trooper Eric Zona was charged Friday for allegedly repeatedly exposing himself to a woman at the Greensburg barracks in October. The victim told police Zona offered her a discount on State Police merchandise in the annex store if she would expose her breasts and watch him perform a sex act.

Pennsylvania's attorney general is scheduled to submit a written statement today, regarding her ability to do her job with a suspended law license. Kathleen Kane's spokesperson announced Friday that she will meet a noon deadline for the statement but will not appear at her final Senate hearing Tuesday.

The Powerball jackpot is growing. Lottery officials say no one matched all six numbers Saturday, meaning the winnings are expected to reach over a billion dollars for Wednesday's drawing. The jackpot is the biggest in U.S. history.

Police are investigating a homicide in Sheraden. Officers were called to Universal Street yesterday for a report of shots fired. Upon arrival they found a vehicle had crashed into a pole. Aman was found dead in the car but the cause of death has not been released.

A man is hospitalized with burns following a fire in Pittsburgh. Officers, firefighters and paramedics were called to a home on East Warrington Avenue in Beltzhoover yesterday afternoon for a medical alarm. When authorities arrived on scene they found a man in a wheelchair, on fire in the kitchen of the home. He was taken to UPMC Mercy in critical condition.

A man is facing charges after being caught with 375 stamp bags of heroin. Officers arrested Carlos Evans last week following a month-long investigation that led to a search of his Washington residence. Detectives also found more than an ounce of cocaine and drug paraphernalia.

A slump in the coal industry is taking a toll on a big U.S. company. The country's second largest coal miner Arch Coal filed for bankruptcy Monday. A drop in coal prices has left the company over four billion dollars in debt. Analysts blame stricter pollution controls and competition from natural gas as big problems for the industry.

Mothers Against Drunk Driving is getting involved in the push to get "affluenza" teen Ethan Couch's case moved to adult court. They've launched a petition on MADD.org saying Couch shouldn't be considered a juvenile because he's shown "blatant disregard for the law." MADD says they were outraged when a judge gave Couch ten years probation in 2014 for a North Texas drunk driving crash which left four dead.

A Beltzhoover man who was found engulfed in flames in his wheelchair inside his home, has died. Marris Pritchard was pronounced dead at the hospital yesterday morning.

State Attorney General Kathleen Kane is getting some help with her legal troubles. Kane was not present for yesterday's final Senate hearing to decide if she can perform her job duties with a suspended law license, but former Governor Ed Rendell was. Rendell testified that as the district attorney of Philadelphia, he did not need a law license, and neither does Kane.

Authorities in Allegheny County are asking for the public's help identifying a bank robbery suspect. The robbery happened yesterday at the PNC Bank on McNeilly Road in Baldwin. The man displayed a gun and fled the scene with an undisclosed amount of cash.

Many Americans approve of President Obama's executive actions on gun control and a majority say they would like to see the next president do even more. A new Reuters/Ipsos poll shows that half of Americans supported the stricter gun rules Obama recently put in place without Congressional cooperation.

A Trafford man is facing DUI charges in connection to a wrong-way crash in Penn Township. A passenger in another car caught the incident on video, which shows Jonathan Lukart driving on the wrong side of Route 130 Tuesday morning. He eventually hit another car near Lucci's Restaurant. No one was seriously injured. Lukart is already awaiting trial for assault by vehicle while DUI.

Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump is going to be front and center at tonight's debate in South Carolina, and he thinks he knows at least one of the questions that'll come up. "hardware failure" yesterday left a lot of its processing systems unavailable last night.

Family and friends will gather today for the funeral of a 13-year-old Virginia girl who was murdered last week. Thirteen-year-old Nicole Lovell went missing last Wednesday and her body was found three days later. Two Virginia Tech University students are charged in the girl's stabbing death.

A former teacher's aide in the Sto-Rox School District who reportedly had sex with a student, is going to prison. Matthew Bertovich was sentenced yesterday to five and a half to eleven years in prison. Back in November, Bertovich pleaded guilty to 14 out of the 20 charges against him.

A police dog killed in the line of duty is being remembered. Dozens of police officers attended a memorial service Thursday for K-9 Officer Aren. Sears is accelerating up plans to shutter stores across the country. The company, which operates Sears and Kmart stores, reports sales were down about seven-percent in the fourth quarter. The retailer plans to shut down at least 50 unprofitable stores and is looking at selling off its Sears Auto Center business.

Governor Tom Wolf is proposing a nearly 33-billion-dollar state budget. It would raise the personal income tax and expand the sales tax base to help close a deficit expected to reach two-billion-dollars in 2017.

The IRS says thieves used stolen personal information to access the agency's e-filing PIN service. About 464-thousand Social Security numbers were used in the attack on the agency's system. Over 100-thousand of these numbers allowed the attackers to get an Electronic Filing pin.

A McKeesport man is facing charges for allegedly selling the heroin that caused a deadly overdose. Raymond Craighead was arrested over the weekend after the victim died at Autumn Brook Apartments in Greensburg. Multiple witnesses told police Craighead supplied the heroin. Almost 30 stamp bags of the drug were found in Craighead's possession.

Hundreds of Southwest Airlines pilots protested the lack of progress over a new contract. Members of the Southwest Airlines Pilots' Association lined the streets in Las Vegas yesterday, while the airline held an employee rally.

The Turnpike Commission is apologizing for the backup on the Turnpike that left hundreds of people stranded during the height of winter storm Jonas. Turnpike Chairman Sean Logan says he is sorry for the incident, claiming no Pennsylvanian should have to endure those conditions on any state road. A Pittsburgh police sergeant is being suspended pending termination. Sergeant Stephen Matakovich was caught on video punching a teenager at Heinz Field during the WPIAL championship games in November. The original charges were dropped, but the FBI reopened the investigation and Allegheny County District Attorney Stephen Zappala recently refiled the charges.

OneJet's CEO said it's the largest investment the airline has made to date in any city. OneJet already provides nonstop flights between Pittsburgh International Airport, Milwaukee and Indianapolis.

Service employees at Washington Hospital are getting raises as part of their new contracts. The workers voted to accept a three-year deal Wednesday and said the agreement will bring them to 15dollars an hour by 2019. The contract also reportedly maintains affordable healthcare for all three years.

A Senate subcommittee is looking at President Obama's request for nearly two-billion-dollars to combat the Zika virus. CDC Director Dr. Tom Frieden says the request will help to combat the spreading virus. A state representative is calling for all Catholic Dioceses in Pennsylvania to be investigated for sexual abuse. Mark Rozzi says a widespread investigation is the only way to get to the tmth. He also wants abuse hotlines for victims set up in every state.

Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders is not letting up on his demand that Hillary Clinton release the transcript from her speech to Wall Street. In last night's debate on Univision, Sanders said Clinton received nearly a quarter of a million dollars for the speech.

Pennsylvania Wal-Mart and Sam's Club workers are getting raises. The company recently announced that all employees hired before January 1st, 2016 will now make at least ten-dollars-an-hour. The bump is part of a two-year commitment to higher pay, better training, and additional educational opportunities for its workers.

Five people have died & three others were hurt after a Wednesday night shooting at a Wilksburg backyard barbeque. Shots were fired just before 11 pm on Franklin Ave. A witness allegedly heard over two dozen shots fired.

The nation's wholesale businesses saw a decline in sales of more than 430 million dollars in January or one-point-three percent. It's the sixth decline in seven months. Manufacturer inventory stockpiles grew unexpectedly by point-three percent. Economists had predicted a slight decline as businesses have worked to reduce inventory.

The federal government is warning companies that make student loans not to be in a hurry to put those loans into default. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau said yesterday the companies could be breaking the law if they put borrowers in default when their co-signer dies or declares bankruptcy.

Authorities in Washington, DC are bringing charges against a man who was shot at the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center Monday after brandishing a weapon. Capitol Police identified Larry Dawson as the suspect and said he's been charged with assault with a deadly weapon.

Police are investigating an attempted child luring in Washington. Multiple kids were approached by a man in a white work van Sunday night in the area of Beech Street. The suspect reportedly offered the children candy and asked them to get into the vehicle. He is described as a middle-aged white man with a dark beard.

The trial of George Biegenwald is underway in Allegheny County. Jury selection began yesterday, Biegenwald is charged with homicide and abuse of a corpse after allegedly killing his girlfriend Donna See and burying her behind his house.

Authorities are identifying the man found dead in a home in Hampton. Glenn Fisher was found dead in a home on Trotter Drive Sunday night. The medical examiner ruled that Fisher died from asphyxiation due to manual strangulation. His death has been ruled a homicide.

The City of Pittsburgh is hoping to protect Enright Park in East Liberty. The Mayor's office announced last week that the city is directing the developers of Penn Plaza to work with the Department of City Planning to work on agreements to protect the park. The park is expected to remain publicly owned.

Cranberry Township fire, EMS and police agencies are offering free car seat checks next month.

A man is facing charges following a police chase in Butler Township. Justin Crispin is accused of DUI, fleeing police and committing multiple traffic violations during last week's chase, which reached speeds of 90-miles-an-hour and lasted about four miles. An officer parked on Route 8 claims he saw Crispin driving all over the road and crossing into opposing traffic. The chase ended at Route 8 and McCalmont Road when Crispin stopped at a red light.

The FBI says it's been able to crack the iPhone of one of the San Bernardino shooters without Apple's help. Now that investigators are in the phone of shooter Syed Farook, the Justice Department is withdrawing its legal action against the company.

Americans are drinking less soda than they have in 30 years. Sales of carbonated drinks fell for the eleventh year in a row last year. A report by industry tracker Beverage Digest says soda consumption hit a 30-year low in 2015.

New research finds that a simple blood test may soon be used to diagnose a concussion. The study shows a protein linked with head trauma could be present in the blood up to a week after suffering the injury.

A former Plum High School teacher, charged with having sex with a student, is being allowed to make a plea deal. The judge ruled yesterday that Jason Cooper can enter a guilty plea in exchange for a prison sentence of 18-to-36 months. He will also be required to register as a sex offender. The judge says the plea deal angered him, but he accepted it to spare the victim from having to testify.

Pittsburgh Mayor Bill Peduto is in San Diego for a forum of mayors competing for the Smart City Challenge. It's a federal program that will provide the winning city with more than 50-million-dollars to build technology-based systems to address transportation and transit challenges. Nearly 80 cities applied for the Smart Cities Challenge and Pittsburgh is one of seven finalists. A winner will be announced in June.

Two people are facing charges for allegedly trying to keep a child from testifying against her suspected abuser. James Burnsworth allegedly paid Samantha Howes to keep the victim from testifying at his preliminary hearing in Washington County court last week. He is also accused of trying to bribe Howes to say she inflicted bruises on the victim. Both are being charged with obstructing child abuse reports and intimidating a witness.
