WHZT FM 3rd Quarter 2019 Issues and Programs

ISSUE 1- EDUCATION, YOUTH AND BUSINESS

TOPIC: Rainbow Push College Tours, 09/01/2019, 6AM, 20 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Davida Mathis, President of the Rainbow Push Greenville chapter came in to discuss the mission of the organization which is to uplift the community through outreach and involvement. Ms. Mathis went on to talk about the organization's partnership with the National Council of Negro Women. Through this partnership free college tours would be offered to High School students in the area.

ISSUES COVERED: Higher Education

TOPIC: Outstanding Youth Awards, 08/11/2019, 6AM, 20 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Brittney Brackett, Founder of the Outstanding Youth Awards came in to talk about the awards. She noted that her mission is to encourage youth to be the best they can be in various areas of life. Ms. Brackett expressed how important it is for young people to know that their efforts are seen and appreciated. The public was called upon to nominate a young person who is doing exceptional things in the areas of academics, arts, sports, entrepreneurship and more. An event to honor those chosen was scheduled to be held in Greenville.

ISSUES COVERED: Youth excellence

TOPIC: YMCA Teen Achievers, 07/28/2019, 6:25, 12 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Jessica Sharp of the YMCA of Greenville came in to talk about the Teen Achievers program. The program is offered to High School underclassmen in an effort to help them adjust to high school as well as to prepare them for young adult life. Leaders in the community are invited in to talk with the youth about different career fields, life issues, higher education and more.

TOPIC: Urban Divinity School, 08/11/2019, 6AM, 20 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Pastor Curtis Johnson and Activist Traci Fant came in to discuss the formation of the Urban Divinity School. The explained the purpose of the school as existing to prepare students for positions in ecclesial, social and academic leadership and service by equipping them with both the practical and critical skills necessary to affect change in their churches and communities as well as their academic and professional institutions. The school is the first of its kind in the Upstate of South Carolina

ISSUE 2- HEALTH, FITNESS AND WELLNESS

TOPIC: Maranatha Farms, 8/18/2019 6:20AM, 12 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Curtis Miller, Manager of Maranatha Farms in Greenville came in to discuss the Farm, its origin and how it benefits the community. The farm began at Maranatha Seventh Day Adventist church in Greenville. The focus is to help the community eat healthier by growing organic fruits and vegetables and selling them at a low cost. Mr. Miller cited the large number of residents living with high blood pressure, diabetes and obesity as an impetus for the farm's origination.

ISSUES COVERED: The benefits of healthy food

TOPIC: Heart Health, 08/04/19, 6AM, 18 minutes

SYNOPSIS: AnMed Health Doctor, Jeremy Parker came in to discuss heart health awareness, the fact that heart disease is prevalent in the south and how heart disease disproportionately affects minority communities. Dr. Parker discussed the importance of a healthy diet rich in green leafy vegetables. He talked about the signs and symptoms of a heart attack, how family history affects chances of heart disease. He also discussed what people can do to improve heart health and also talked about his thoughts on the Keto diet.

ISSUES COVERED: The benefits of healthy food and heart health

TOPIC: Prisma Health Stroke Awareness, 09/22/19, 6AM, 20 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Dr. Shah of Prisma Health Systems came in to discuss the topic of Stroke and Stroke awareness. Dr. Shah discussed the definition of a stroke, the different types of stroke, stroke symptoms and subjects such as who is most at risk and what treatments are available to stroke victims. The doctor went on to inform the community about the "stroke camps" that Prisma Health organized to assist those who have suffered a stroke.

ISSUES COVERED: Stroke Awareness

TOPIC: Obesity and Weight, 7/14/2019, 6AM, 19 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Dr. Peter Bechtel, AnMed Health Bariatric Surgeon came in to talk about the problem of obesity which tends to lead to many other illnesses including high blood pressure, diabetes and stroke. The doctor discussed the fact that when obesity has reached a dangerous level where these other problems have set in then the patient may want to consider weight loss surgery. He discussed who may be eligible, the different surgeries available such as gastric bypass and the gastric sleeve. One of Dr. Bechtel's patients, Steve Smith also came in to discuss his experience with the Gastric Sleeve. He informed that prior to the surgery he was over 300 pounds, had high blood pressure and diabetes. After the surgery he lost over one hundred pounds, his blood pressure returned to normal and he no longer is a diabetic.

SYNOPSIS: Nika White came in to talk about the Greenville Chamber of Commerce Diversity and Inclusion Summit. The Summit is described as an all day event designed to energize diversity and inclusion efforts and help companies and individuals discover innovation found with inclusion minded leadership.

ISSUE 4- COMMUNITY SERVICES

TOPIC: Affordable Housing, 09/29/2019, 6AM, 20 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Pastor James Speed of Allen Temple, A.M.E. Church discussed the affordable housing program the church helps to run.

He discussed the dire need for affordable housing in the Greenville area and encouraged residents to apply for the program which does have a waiting list. He expressed concern in that while Greenville is steadily becoming a community that is growing in popularity and attracting more residents and businesses, that popularity is also causing housing cost to rise tremendously leading to gentrification, people losing their homes and other concerning issues.

TOPIC: My Brother's Keeper, 07/21/19, 6AM, 21 minutes

SYNOPSIS: Antiwan Tate, Executive Director of My Brother's Keeper Spartanburg Chapter and Councilman, Michael Brown, Elected official Delegate for the organization came in to talk about the mission of the group which was launched in 2014 by President Barak Obama in an effort to close the opportunity gaps faces by young men of color. Mr. Brown and Mr. Tate discussed the importance of encouraging mentorships, reducing youth violence and improving life outcomes. They also discussed the open talk sessions and group engagement trips they take with the young men in the group to expose them to various facets of life.
