Sports travelers need food and entertainment beyond their events and Philadelphia has museums, parks and children's attractions nearby. He talked about the impact sports has on our economy, beyond their initial spending, they are more likely to return to the city for vacations or other events.

Jessica Craft, Founder and CEO of Rock to the Future discussed this original program that supports positive youth development and economic empowerment through free, student-driven music programs for Philadelphia youth. Operating in areas that are underserved with enrichment opportunities, Rock to the Future works with the community and the youth participating to create programming that is compelling and fun for them. Thanks to donations and grants hundreds of students participate annually inschool, after school, and during the summer in schools, community locations, and now, in the re-entry programming, within juvenile justice facilities. She notes there is no cost for students to participate, they receive an instrument and supplies, transportation to and from the classes and meals. No auditions required and beginners are welcome but students must maintain a set grade average to participate. The program is studentdriven - youth lead their creation and collaborations and are included in decision-making and taught by trauma informed professional musicians. Programs are provided in English and Spanish. Rock to the Future also addresses the needs of the students at home, with support for family through connections with resources like health, housing, and food security. Students gain self-confidence, a sense of accomplishment, cooperation and patience, abilities they will be able to apply to their studies now and their goals in the future.

Maura McCarthy, CEO of Fairmount Park Conservancy and Allison Schapker, Chief Projects Officer discussed the non-profit Conservancy's work with the City of Philadelphia to restore and improve thousands of acres of public lands, activates parks, and engages the public with the parks. They discussed the ecological, economic, historic, social, cultural and public health value to the community. Deborah Buckson, Executive Director of Historic Odessa Foundation quests. A site featured on the National Park's Highway to Freedom Trail, with the nation's first house museum, Cantwell's Tavern, a bank hosting a permanent art gallery, a pump house and more than 70 acres of grounds, Odessa offers educational and recreational opportunities for all ages. We discussed their new publication, A Storied Past: Collections of Historic Odessa, by Philip Zimmerman Ph.D., that captures the historical character and significance of two important late-18th- century Delaware houses, each of which retains a high percentage of original furnishings and locally made objects. Deb spoke of the need for volunteers, from helping to catalog the thousands of pieces in their collection, but also guiding tours and helping with research. They are looking for history and library science students, too, as research continues on the vast property. Deb gave us the scoop on this year's book choice for their holiday festivities, A Visit From St. Nicholas, the historic Wilson-Warner House will be decorated to honor the 200th anniversary of its publication. Details on special tours and other events for the holidays will be coming soon. And finally, we discussed the 10th Annual Historic Odessa Brewfest, September 9th with more than 58 local, regional, and national breweries, along with daylong musical performances on 2 stages, artisan vendors, Fusion Beer Mile, lawn games, locally sourced food and more to benefit the non-profit foundation's historic conservation efforts as well as its diverse educational programming.

Internist Dr Avidon Appel, who diagnoses and treats diseases & illnesses in adult patients, discussed men's general health. He notes they are less likely to seek help without spousal pressure, they shrug off any issues they may be experiencing and unfortunately, unlike their cars, they don't come with a 'check your engine list!' We

discussed the increasing numbers of cancer and other diseases we think of as ageonset, and he reminds us that a symptom such as ED could be a sign of cardiovascular or endocrine disease. He worries about our plastic exposure and recommends glass and metal over single-use containers. He advises hydration, exercise and proper sleep as the best routine for maintaining health and tells us, if something doesn't feel right and it doesn't get better fast, see a doctor. He asks men – or their partners – to take time to write down questions and concerns before a doctor's visit – for a general 'check list' he also recommends visiting the CDC website.

Dr. Kara Odom Walker, Executive Vice President, Chief Population Health Officer, Nemours Children's Health, discussed the health system's commitment to community health, the social determinants of health as well as food insecurity in the region. She spoke on the surprising three areas most Delawareans reported as impacting their health and security most – stable housing, food and internet access. Not only do these issues affect health, they impact education, employment and mental health. She discussed their unique National Office, their voice in DC, the only children's hospital to maintain an office to inform and lobby on behalf of health. Nemours is working to establish youth behavioral health care in emergency rooms, offer primary preventative care, create school-based Wellness Centers that address social services and health, and support the SNAP program for continuing food access for families.

Maryanne McGerty-Sieber, Consumer Product Safety Investigator with the Consumer Product Safety Commission, discussed back to school safety, from art supplies to athletic gear, backpacks and clothing.

Philadelphia Focus August 14, 2023 4:30PM 30 minutes

Zoraida Cordero, Area Director for the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention of Greater Philadelphia discussed the 12th leading cause of death in the US, suicide. We discussed their mission to save lives and bring hope to those affected by suicide through research, education and awareness campaigns, and programs and events for the community. We spoke of mental recognizing the difference between common moods and situations where professional help is needed, especially for young people. She discussed their main goal, getting us to talk about mental health and suicide, out in the open, and being willing to talk to someone who may be struggling. She described their new campaign, Talk Away The Dark, online videos and easy to follow guides to help you begin a conversation about suicide, from opening lines to follow through with mental health professionals. Together with 988, the national crisis talk/text number, Talk Away The Dark gives us the resources to offer help and hope to anyone struggling.

Philadelphia Focus August 21, 2023 10:30AM 30-minutes

Dennis Carradin, Founder and CEO of The Trauma Survivor Foundation returned to offer an update on their work, giving survivors of traumatic events access to a network of trained trauma therapists. We talked about his experiences that led to TSF, a chance encounter with a donut shop clerk who revealed her PTSD and lack of funds for help, and his work with the families and survivors of a school shooting. He realized that many lacked 'follow up,' they were left to navigate mental health resources on their own. Since the beginning of the Foundation over 30,000 survivors of various traumatic events: mass shootings, natural disasters, line of duty deaths, motor vehicle collisions, sexual abuse or assault, physical abuse or assault, accidents, illnesses, witness to violence and others were helped through crisis intervention by over 2,500 trained trauma therapists and crisis interventionists participating.

We talked about trauma, what it is and what it isn't when the term is sometimes overused. He asks us to consider magnitude, is it an inconvenience or annoyance or is it affecting your daily life. We discussed the ongoing Hospital Heroes Food Drive, so far providing over 30,000 meals delivered to nurses, doctors, EMS and first responders. They have partnered with hundreds of restaurants to deliver the meals across the region and are looking for individual and business support to keep the program running. Finally, we talked about an easy, fun way to support their work, the 2023 Delaware Beer Fest! It's October 14 in the Figure 8 Barn on the grounds of magnificent Bellevue State Park. You'll enjoy over a hundred Beer selections from over 70 Breweries. There will also be food trucks, games and activities and more beer.

Philadelphia Focus September 25, 2023 10:30AM 20 minutes of a 30-minute program

Robb Reichard, Executive Director of AIDS Fund, and Fatima Sangare, Lead Medical Case manager for Bebashi, discussed their work in prevention of HIV and care for those living with it as we approach the 37th Annual AIDS Walk Philly. AIDS Fund works with area service providers to make emergency grants directly to clients to allow them to maintain their treatment, housing and rent, transportation, food, co-pays, small amounts that could keep them from losing their home or becoming unable to stay with their treatment. Fatima offered examples of how these grants from the AIDS Fund have allowed her clients to stay housed and in treatment. Robb notes that 25% of new HIV and other STD transmissions are among young people, 13 to 24 and it is through sexual exposure. They discussed the need for more education and access to prevention for these groups. We spoke again of their goal, zero stigma, zero transmission and zero deaths. Robb explains stigma prevents information and education to get to those who need it, transmission prevention is possible through PREP and PEP 'Morning After' medications, and through AIDS treatments that bring the virus to undetectable. He notes that with the introduction of PREP and new treatment the transmissions among white gay men has dropped considerably. We talked about this year's AIDS Walk Philly, October 15th from the Art Museum along Kelly Drive. Registration is now open

with walk-ups welcome. The event will begin with the reading of names and a display of AIDS Quilt panels and all funds will support the grants offered through AIDS Fund.

Philadelphia Focus September 11, 2023 10:30AM 30 minutes

Stephenie Bailey, Continuing Education Manager at Winterthur Museum, Garden and Library, and Elizabeth 'Liz' Way, guest curator for the Ann Lowe exhibit and Associate Curator at The Museum at the Fashion Institute of Technology discussed their upcoming exhibition, Ann Lowe: American Couturier. Lowe is recognized as first African American to become a noted fashion designer; from the 1920s through the mid '60s she was "Society's Best-Kept Secret" designing gowns for bold names including the Rockefeller, Marjorie Merriweather Post, Olivia de Havilland. She created Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy's iconic 1953 wedding dress. The exhibition was inspired by the research of the late Winterthur curator Margaret Powell and Ms Way will bring more than 40 examples of Lowe's work from both private and institutional collections. Some of these gowns have never before been on public view. Winterthur, the premier museum of American decorative arts, put its world-renowned textile conservation team to work with the University of Delaware to recreate Kennedy's fragile wedding gown and they pioneered a 3D printing technique to create customized mannequins for the exhibition. The recreated dress will then go to the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum for use in their programming. The exhibition will also live on in its catalog, Ann Lowe, American Couturier (Rizzoli) will be the first scholarly representation of Lowe's contributions to 20th-century couture in the US.

We discussed AIDS and HIV in Philadelphia, where again it disproportionately affects the disenfranchised, low income and Black and Brown communities. Robb explains stigma prevents information and education to get to those who need it, transmission prevention is possible through PREP and PEP 'Morning After' medications, and through AIDS treatments that bring the virus to undetectable. He notes that with the introduction of PREP and new treatment the transmissions among white gay men has dropped considerably.
