BUT THESE SIGNS STARTED A HOT BUTTON CONVERSATION WITH FOLKS WHO CALL THE CD HOME ABOUT YOUTH AND GUN VIOLENCE.  
SOME SEE THE VALUE IN THIS MESSAGE...BUT WANT TO SEE SOME POSITIVE NEWS ABOUT THEIR COMMUNITY TOO.

IN JULY 2002, THE D-O-C CHANGED GOOD TIME CODING, WHICH CONTAINED THE COMPUTER GLITCH.  
IN DECEMBER 2012- A VICTIM`S FAMILY BROUGHT UP CONCERN ABOUT THE RELEASE OF AN OFFENDER, WHICH WAS THE FIRST TIME THE DEPARTMENT BECAME AWARE OF THE ISSUE.  
FROM DECEMBER 2012 TO 2015- THE DOC WORKED TO FIX THE PROBLEM, BUT THE CODING FIX WAS REPEATEDLY DELAYED.

IT'S A CONTROVERSIAL APPROACH TO DRUG USE ... BUT USC EVENTS SAY IT'S WILLING TO TRY IT IF IT COULD SAVE LIVES. MEANWHILE, TACOMA AND THE TACOMA DOME ARE PREPARING TO HOST FREAKNIGHT FOR THE VERY FIRST TIME ... DESPITE A DEADLY DECADE IN SEATTLE.

BUT IN THE WAKE OF THE CRASH THEY HAVE PLEDGED STOP DRIVING TOURISTS OVER THE AURORA BRIDGE IF OR WHEN THEY'RE ALLOWED TO RE-OPEN, MEANING THE BOATS WOULD LIKELY TRAVEL OVER OTHER SMALLER BRIDGES AROUND LAKE UNION.
