EXPEDIA'S MOVE IS SEEN AS A PLUS BY SOME WHO HAVE BUSINESSES NEAR THE NEW CAMPUS.. S-DOT IS WORKING WITH THE COMPANY TO COME UP WITH A SOLUTION FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF INCREASED TRAFFIC.. EXPEDIA SAYS IT WILL GIVE ITS EMPLOYEES INCENTIVES LIKE ORCA PASSES TO USE PUBLIC TRANSIT

OPPONENTS SAY THESE AREN'T THE KIND OF JOBS SEATTLE WANTS.

AND THE COAST GUARD ON THE WATER. ARE IMPLEMENTING WHAT THEY CALL A FIRST AMENDMENT ZONE AROUND THE OIL RIG .. IF PROTESTORS GET CLOSER THEN 100 YARDS ONCE IT'S MOORED.. THEY FACE FINES, PENALTIES.. EVEN ARRESTS.. THE COAST GUARD AND PORT SECURITY SAYS THEY PLAN ON KEEPING A CLOSE EYE ON THE RIG AND PROTESTORS IN THE COMING DAYS.

THE PORT IS STILL ASKING THE COMPANIES TO PUT A HOLD ON THEIR PLANS. SHELL PROMISES HUNDREDS OF JOBS AND MILLIONS OF DOLLARS PUMPED INTO THE LOCAL ECONOMY.

WITH ESTIMATED CROWDS OF 200-THOUSAND, PIERCE COUNTY IS SCRAMBLING TO MAKE SURE THERE`S ENOUGH SECURITY TO HANDLE SPECTATORS AND TRAFFIC.

THE COUNTY NEEDS AT LEAST 200 MORE OFFICERS TO COVER THE WEEK OF THE EVENT.. CITIES LIKE TACOMA, LAKEWOOD, AND UNIVERSITY PLACE ARE HELPING OUT.. BUT THE COUNTY WILL HAVE TO PAY.. INCLUDING COVERING THE COST OF COAST GUARD OPERATIONS ON THE WATER.

BECAUSE THEY DON`T WANT TO TIP THEIR SECURITY PLANS, COUNTY OFFICIALS WON`T DIVULGE THE SECURITY BUDGET UNTIL AFTER THE EVENT.. PIERCE COUNTY RECEIVES 4 MILLION FROM THE USGA TO HOST THE EVENT, BUT WITH ADDED SECURITY AND OTHER EXPENSES.. THE COUNTY NOW ADMITS IT WILL LIKELY JUST BREAK EVEN.

GOLDEN ALSO SAYS THAT ANOTHER REASON PEOPLE DON'T ALWAYS MAKE GOOD EYE WITNESSES IS BECAUSE WE'RE SIMPLY NOT PAYING ATTENTION. WE'RE DISTRACTED OR ON OUR CELL PHONES AND WE DON'T PRACTICE LOOKING UP AND TAKING NOTE OF WHAT AND WHO IS AROUND US. OFFICER GOLDEN SAYS THERE ARE THINGS WE CAN DO TO MAKE BETTER EYE WITNESSES. FOR INSTANCE HAIR COLOR, SKIN COLOR AND WHETHER OR THE NOT THE INDIVIDUAL HAS FACIAL HAIR. BASICALLY PICK ONE OR TWO THINGS TO FOCUS ON AND THEN CALL POLICE IMMEDIATELY-DON'T WAIT AS MEMORY OF WHAT WE SAW CAN QUICKLY FADE.

BUT OUR INVESTIGATION FOUND THAT SEATTLE POLICE OFFICERS AREN'T ALWAYS USING IT WHEN THEY SHOULD. WE LOOKED THROUGH HUNDREDS OF INTERNAL POLICE INVESTIGATIONS GOING BACK TO 2007 ... AND FOUND 53 CASES AGAINST OFFICERS WHERE THERE WAS NO IN-CAR VIDEO ... BECAUSE THE OFFICER UNDER INVESTIGATION, FAILED TO TURN IT ON.

WE FOUND ANOTHER 65 INSTANCES SINCE JUST THE START OF 2014 WHERE OFFICERS MAY HAVE ALSO FAILED TO FULLY FOLLOW THE IN-CAR VIDEO POLICY. THOSE CASES WERE REFERRED TO OPA ... BUT NEVER TURNED INTO FULL INVESTIGATIONS.

IN FACT, IN-CAR VIDEO TECHNOLOGY IS REALLY QUITE SIMPLE. THERE`S A CAMERA THAT RECORDS WHAT`S GOING ON IN FRONT OF THE CAR. AND A CAMERA THAT KEEPS AN EYE ON THE BACK SEAT.

BEFORE EACH SHIFT, OFFICERS ARE REQUIRED TO DO A SIMPLE TEST TO MAKE SURE THE SYSTEM IS WORKING. ONCE IN THE FIELD, SEATTLE POLICE OFFICER COREY LAPINSKY SAYS IT TAKES THE SIMPLE PUSH OF A BUTTON TO BEGIN RECORDING.

IF IT`S SO SIMPLE, WHY ARE SOME OFFICERS FAILING TO TURN IT IN? RON SMITH, PRESIDENT OF THE CITY`S POLICE UNION, SAYS IT`S MORE LIKELY THAT OFFICERS WERE TRIPPED UP BY HOW THE IN-CAR VIDEO POLICY WAS WRITTEN.

OPA DIRECTOR PIERCE MURPHY AGREES THAT THE POLICY LEFT TOO MUCH ROOM FOR INTERPRETATION. THAT`S WHY A NEW POLICY WAS PUT INTO PLACE ON FEBRUARY 1ST OF THIS YEAR.

THE DOWNTOWN SAFETY CONNECTION ISN'T FOR EMERGENCIES -- FOR THAT PEOPLE STILL NEED TO CALL 9-1-1. BUT THEY CAN USE THE WEBSITE TO REPORT NUISANCES, GRAFITI, AGGRESSIVE PANHANDLERS AND OTHER CONCERNS.

EVERY TIME YOU REPORT SOMETHING, THE DOWNTOWN SEATTLE ASSOCIATION PROMISES TO FOLLOW UP AND MAKE SURE SOMEONE IS DOING SOMETHING ABOUT YOUR COMPLAINT.

JUST TWO DAYS LATER, TWO MEN HOLDING HANDS SAY THEY WERE CONFRONTED BY A MAN WHO SPIT ON THEM AND YELLED SLURS.  
THESE LATEST ANTI GAY ASSAULTS HAPPENING JUST AS THE CITY ROLLS OUT IT'S SAFE PLACE PROGRAM.. WHERE BUSINESSES AOUND CAPITOL HILL CREATE A SPACE FOR ANYONE WHO FEELS THREATENED OR UNSAFE... A FEELING THAT SEEMS TO BE ON THE RISE AROUND CAPITOL HILL.  
CHIP SAYS HE STILL FEELS SAFE MOST OF THE TIME UP HERE, BUT HE CAN ALSO SPOT HIS OWN BLOODSTAINS ON THE SIDEWALK OUTSIDE HIS HOME.. WHICH PUTS HIM MORE ON GUARD.
