Citizens believe that had our local hospital not shut down their OB department, this family would not have been forced to travel out of town to see an OBGYN doctor and she and her son would today be alive. Also, a second husband and pregnant mother had a blow out on I-25 at about 2: a. m. three days after our local hospital shut down the OB department. This family had to call a family member to go pick them up and drive them to her doctor's appointment in Santa Fe. The hospital CEO has said he plans to reopen the OB department in the future but the community does not believe this to be true. Duration of talk: 8:10 a. m. to 9:30 a. m.

Phone interview with New Mexico cabinet secretary of tourism, Barbara Latham who informed the community of the marketing plan the state is working on to promote tourism around the world. The new state slogan is, "New Mexico True". She reported that the slogen is working and bringing many more tourists to the state. Duration of talk: 9: a. m. to 9:45 a. m.
