The roadway was closed for 150 days so crews could raise it 18 inches to alleviate chronic flooding. Today's rain didn't cause any major problems, but crews still have a lot of work to do. For years residents off Alf Coleman Road in Panama City Beach have been plagued by low-lying flooding with every heavy rain. Last fall city officials approved a 5.3-million-dollar project to build up the roadway by 18 inches. Phase one dealt with the middle section of the road, between the entrance of Lowe's and Cabana Boulevard. This area had to be closed for complete reconstruction, primarily due to the proximity of wetlands on both sides of the corridor. We are not able to create a temporary alternative roadway to do that.</p>
