Last week's rainfall was beneficial to our watersheds. Many locations in our area picked up 2-3" of rainfall. Here is what the impact was:

The BIG winner was EV. Spence.

Spence had a 1 week increase of 3,196 acre feet of water. That's just over 1 Billion Gallons! This takes E.V. Spence from 8.9% full to 9.5% full.

*Spence is a huge lake! Think of pouring a pitcher of water into a bathtub. It barely raises the level of the tub. However, you added a significant amount of water. This is similar to what we've seen. An increase of over one billion gallons is huge! The percentage increase doesn't appear to be all that impressive though, given the size of the lake.

*Spence has also been a big 1 year winner. The lake has increased from 12,134 acre feet to 48,955 acre feet in the last 12 months. That is just shy of 12 Billion Gallons of added water!

The next BIG winner was JB Thomas.

*Lake Thomas was less than 1% full just a few short years ago and was written off by many. Today, JB Thomas stands at 73.1% full. That is up from 72.6% one week ago.

*The total one year gain for JB Thomas has been 54,526 acre feet. That is just over 17.5 Billion Gallons of new water.

OH Ivie was a winner with this last storm but has a net one year loss of water.

*OH Ive increased from 12.6% of capacity to 12.8% or 123,823 Gallons of new water.

*However, for the last year, Ivie has dropped from 84,742 acre feet or 15.3% of capacity to 71,002 acre feet or 12.8% of capacity. This is a net loss of just under 4.5 Billion Gallons of water.

*** The good news is that we are entering the winter season. Evaporation rates are much slower in the winter months, so we will be able to retain some of this water. When we get our Spring Rains, we should be able to add to this. ***




