

EACH QUARTER, KTTH PLACES IN ITS PUBLIC INSPECTION FILE A LIST OF WHAT IT CONSIDERS TO HAVE BEEN SIGNIFICANT PROGRAMMING IN CATEGORIES THAT IT HAS DEEMED OF IMPORTANCE TO THE COMMUNITY.

THE ATTACHED QUARTERLY LISTING OF PROBLEMS AND NEEDS IS BEING FILED IN THE PUBLIC INSPECTION FILE OF KTTH IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FCC REQUIREMENTS FOR THE THREE-MONTH PERIOD OF JANUARY 1 TO MARCH 31, 2015.

WHILE THIS LIST CONTAINS A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF KTTH'S TYPICAL NEWS AND TALK SHOW BROADCASTING, IT DOES NOT INCLUDE ALL ITEMS BROADCAST BY THE STATION DURING THE THREE MONTH PERIOD.

KTTH – PROGRAMMING

770 KTTH'S TALK PROGRAMMING TACKLES ISSUES THAT MATTER MOST TO THE PEOPLE OF THE NORTHWEST. LOCAL TALK SHOWS FOCUS ON NEWS STORIES OF THE DAY AND OTHER TOPICS DEEMED IMPORTANT TO THE LISTENING AUDIENCE. KTTH'S INFORMATIVE AND ENGAGING HOSTS PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY WITH AN OUTLET TO EXPRESS THEIR OWN PERSONAL VIEWS, WHILE GIVING THE PUBLIC A CHANCE TO DISCUSS WHAT MATTERS TO THEM.

KTTH'S QUARTERLY ISSUES ARE LISTED BY CATEGORIES DETERMINED TO BE IMPORTANT TO THE LISTENING AUDIENCE. THESE CATEGORIES ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. SAFETY – INCLUDES ISSUES SUCH AS POLICE/COMMUNITY RELATIONS, LAW ENFORCEMENT, GUN CONTROL, NATURAL DISASTERS, HUMAN WELFARE, DRUG ABUSE/PREVENTION, THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM, AND ALL OTHER ISSUES PERTAINING TO GENERAL SAFETY AND SAFETY PREVENTION.
2. EDUCATION AND CULTURE – INCLUDES ISSUES SUCH AS CHILDHOOD EDUCATION, PUBLIC EDUCATION, REFORM EFFORTS, SCHOOL VIOLENCE/DISCIPLINE, HIGHER EDUCATION, TEACHING, AND OTHER ARTS, LITERATURE AND COMMUNICATION-RELATED ISSUES THAT PERTAIN TO EDUCATION. IT ALSO INCLUDES ITEMS OF CULTURAL EDUCATION AND CULTURAL APPRECIATION.

3. BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY – INCLUDES ISSUES SUCH AS THE ECONOMY, BUSINESS PRACTICES, NEW TECHNOLOGY PRODUCTS, INDUSTRY IN THE PUGET SOUND REGION, JOB TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT.
4. INTEGRITY – INCLUDES ISSUES OF MORAL AND ETHICAL DECISION MAKING, ISSUES FACED BY THE ELDERLY, MINORITIES AND OTHER GENDER-SPECIFIC ISSUES. THE INTEGRITY CATEGORY ALSO INCLUDES COVERAGE OF RELIGIOUS GROUPS, THE HOMOSEXUAL COMMUNITY AND THE HOMELESS, AS WELL AS LOCAL AND NATIONAL GOVERNMENTAL POLICIES THAT AFFECT THESE GROUPS.
5. HEALTH – INCLUDES NUTRITION, PHYSICAL FITNESS, MENTAL AND PREVENTATIVE HEALTH, GOVERNMENT HEALTHCARE POLICIES, LOCAL AND NATIONAL REFORM EFFORTS, AS WELL AS THE EFFECTS OF THE ENVIRONMENT ON COMMUNITY’S WELL-BEING.
6. GROWTH – INCLUDES ISSUES REFLECTING POPULATION, TRAFFIC, TRANSPORTATION, INFLATION, THE ECONOMY, TRADE, CONSUMER ISSUES, TAX REFORM, THE POPULATION’S EFFECTS ON THE ENVIRONMENT, AIR AND WATER POLLUTION, ALTERNATIVE ENERGY AND LEGISLATION INVOLVING LOCAL AND NATIONAL GROWTH.
7. POLITICS AND GLOBAL ISSUES – INCLUDES ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE GOVERNMENT, LEGISLATION, LOCAL AND NATIONAL ELECTIONS, TAXES, WAR, TERRORISM, ANTI-TERRORISM EFFORTS, POLITICAL DEBATE, LOCAL AND NATIONAL CAMPAIGNS, LAWS AND LAW REFORM, ALL BRANCHES OF THE MILITARY, ISSUES FACED BY LOCAL MILITARY FAMILIES, VOTING AND ALL OTHER REFORM EFFORTS.

Summary: David Boze speaks with Karlyn Bowman, Senior Fellow at American Enterprise Institute. He asks if recent events around the nation have impacted people's trust in police officers. Bowman says that surprisingly, public opinion polls have shown that people still believe police have a positive impact on their communities.
