This year's A Capitol Fourth - the largest July 4th television celebration - features an all-star lineup including Jimmy Buffet, Joshua Bell, The Beach Boys, The Temptations, and a special performance by soprano Renée Fleming, KUED airs the program twice on the holiday, at 7:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m.

The Summer of Adventure takes viewers around the country and the world with series including 10 That Changed America, No Passport Required, Earth's Natural Wonders - Life at the Extremes, and Kingdoms of the Sky.

Earth's Natural Wonders - Life at the Extremes premieres Wednesday, July 11 at 7:00 p.m. The series looks at what it takes for humans to survive in the world's most extreme places. Kingdoms of the Sky, beginning Wednesday, July 11 at 8:00 p.m., takes viewers to three of the world's most remarkable mountain ranges, including the Rocky Mountains, the Himalayas, and the Andes.


