Nestled in the heart of Liberty Park in Salt Lake City, Tracy Aviary is the largest and oldest of only two free-standing aviaries in the nation. The accessible grounds of Tracy Aviary have grown and evolved over their more than 80-year history to become a cultural landmark, botanical garden, and leader in environmental education and conservation. Tracy Aviary inspires curiosity and caring for birds and nature through education and conservation for guests of all ages.

Exhibits, encounters, and landscape exploration beckon visitors to view an amazing assortment of birds and plants. It is home to 135 avian species represented by over 400 birds ranging from those with 10-foot wingspans to those with four-inch wingspans. Birds include native species such as bald eagles, golden eagles, and sandhill cranes and exotic species such as the Chilean flamingos, kea, and southern ground hornbills.

Committed to education, the Aviary has a full-range of programs, including Summer Avian Adventure Camps, community conservation education programs, badge workshops for scouts, Community Scientist opportunities, and preschool classes for the "little chicks" in your life. Daily activities include the wildly popular bird shows (offered Tuesday – Sunday), nose-to-beak encounters with birds on the premises, vet tech and keeper talks, pelican feedings, and more.

There are also numerous volunteer opportunities with focus on horticulture, animal care, and education. Volunteering offers a great opportunity to stay connected with the community while helping foster Tracy Aviary's mission

of inspiring curiosity and caring for birds and nature through education and conservation. More information can be found at tracyaviary. org/volunteer.

The Aviary is open year-round, every day from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Special events are offered throughout the year. Winter offerings include: Enjoy \$1 admission fee on Winter Wednesday February 5; celebrate with someone special at a Valentine's Day Birds & Brews (21+) on February 13; and learn new things at the Empty Nesters Lunchtime Lectures on February 11 and 26. 
