#### UTAH SHAKESPEARE FESTIVAL

The Utah Shakespeare Festival was founded in 1961 in response to two influences: an estimated guarter of a million summer tourists desiring more evening activities after visiting the area's national parks and a young entrepreneur and actor's desire to produce great theatre. Festival founder Fred C. Adams, who at the time was an assistant professor at the then College of Southern Utah, proposed his idea to the Cedar City Council to attract visitors and bring in revenue. "The idea went over like a pregnant pole vaulter, "Adams said. "They thought it was a dumb idea. Really dumb." But historically, the people of southern Utah had a love for drama, especially the works of Shakespeare. Their initial two-week season of The Taming of the Shrew, Hamlet, and The Merchant of Venice attracted over 3,000 spectators and yielded a profit that helped to build the second season.

The Utah Shakespeare Festival has developed exponentially since that first season. They now play to nearly 100,000 patrons who view almost 300 plays each year in three theatres over a 16-week season. It is a year-round operation with over thirty full-time employees and a budget of approximately \$7 million. Each year the Festival produces eight or nine professional plays. In addition, a smaller touring production performs for schools throughout the West during the winter months. In keeping with its mission to entertain, enrich. and educate its audiences, the Festival also offers a variety of activities such as a free pre-play Greenshow, orientations, literary and production seminars, classes, workshops, and backstage tours - making it a true destination theatre, and one of Utah's cultural treasures.

Awarded the 2000 Tony Award for Outstanding Regional Theatre put the Shakespeare Festival on the international map, but the patrons from Utah have known it was great since its early beginnings.

Although the core of the Festival happens during the summer months, the fall season continues to run through October 12. Plays for the 2019 fall season include Joseph and The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, Hamlet, Every Brilliant Thing, and The Price, with tickets available online at bard.org.

The Shakespeare Festival supports the arts, arts education, and inspiring people through theatre. They also support Masterpiece, Great Performances, Midsomer Murders, and The Doctor Blake Mysteries on KUED.


