It goes without saying that television has changed in many ways over the decades, such as the move from black and white to color, or from analog to digital, but one of the most meaningful changes for viewers has been the ever-increasing choices television has been able to offer.

When PBS Utah first signed on the air, most households had access to only a small number of channels, available only with an antenna. Changes in broadcast technology now make it possible for PBS Utah to offer four channels: PBS Utah, World Channel, PBS Kids 24/7, and Create. You can find schedules for these channels in the pages of this program guide.

Not only are there more choices of channels available to viewers, but viewers also now have more choices in *how* they receive their television programs. A significant number still use an antenna. More subscribe to a cable or satellite service. And a growing number choose only to stream their television over the internet.

If you are, or are considering becoming, one of these cord cutters, I hope that you are aware

of the free PBS video app. Featuring hours and hours of free programs, *USA Today* recently called the app, "arguably the best bargain in streaming." Full episodes of your favorite PBS and PBS Utah series and local documentaries can be found there. Even digital-only programs, such as PBS Utah's **Modern Gardener** can be viewed on the app.

I'm very happy to say that we're working right now to make our main channel available as a livestream on the app, although it will be available first on our website, [www.pbsutah.org](http://www.pbsutah.org). Watch that site for more information.

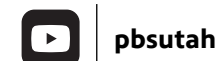

## SPONSOR PROFILE



Plan a getaway to the beautiful Moab Springs Ranch Resort. Nestled beneath Moab's red rock is a cool, shady oasis of majestic cottonwood trees, a flowing waterscape, and comfortable, stylish accommodations. The Ranch is located near Arches National Park, the Colorado River, and downtown Moab, with bike-in, bike-out access to Moab's extensive trail network.

The history of Moab Springs Ranch began with indigenous people who settled and farmed in this fertile place. Later, the oasis was a campsite on the Old Spanish Trail. Moab's first non-native settler chose this well-watered spot and built stone cabins in the 1870s. In the 1890s, the two-story National Historic Register Ranch House was completed. The historic Ranch House was once the largest ranch homestead in the Moab area. The Resort has preserved the historic buildings and nurtured the grove of huge native cottonwood trees. Today's visitor will find this place to be as welcoming as did the generations of desert wanderers who rested there.

The restored historic Ranch House serves as the Front Desk and also houses Horsethief Coffee, which features locally roasted coffee, house-baked goodies, and house-prepared snacks.

Two types of accommodations are offered at the Resort: Stand-alone luxury bungalows with studio-style living and the large one, two, and three-bedroom townhouses. The bungalows include kitchenettes, vaulted ceilings, large private porches with outdoor dining sets,

and drive-up access. The townhouses have separate bedrooms and living areas, complete kitchens, and covered decks and patios for outdoor dining.

Moab Springs Ranch is following strict safety procedures which includes CDC guidelines and local health department requirements. Both the pool and hot tub are closed during this time. However, the resort offers many amenities, including a large private park, ponds, pools, flowing waterscape, hammocks, a campfire circle, on-site vineyards, and spectacular sunset views. The eco-friendly property also provides direct access to the Moab trail system which connects to miles of bike trails.

Moab Springs Ranch is ideally located at the north end of Moab's Main Street, one mile from the Colorado River and Arches National Park.

Moab Springs Ranch has been an anchor to the Moab community for over a century. They are also proud sponsors of the programming on PBS Utah.

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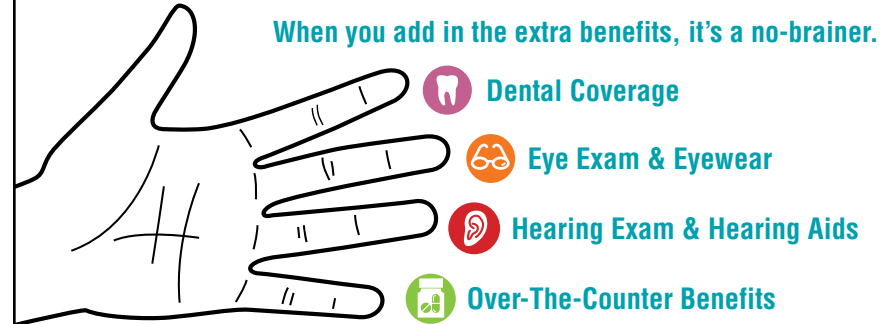
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
