Manager's Memo

In November of 2018, PBS Utah premiered Battle Over Bears Ears, a one-hour documentary that examined the deep connections to place and the vast cultural divides fueling the fight over how the Bears Ears Monument is protected and managed. On Thursday, November 4 at 7:00 p.m., we bring you an updated version of the film, which will also premiere on PBS stations across the country, as well as on the WORLD Channel. Although much has happened around the monument in these three years. including a new executive order expanding the monument, questions remain - whose voices are heard, whose are lost, and how do all sides find common ground in this uncommon place?

The following week, on Thursday, November 11 at 7:00 p.m., we are encoring another powerful local film in commemoration of both Native American Heritage Month as well as Veteran's Day. **Healing the Warrior's Heart** examines the emotional trauma of war through the prism of Native American tradition and ceremony. The program reveals the central role that

military service plays in Native life and explores the spiritual traditions that help returning American Indian soldiers reintegrate into society. It also shows how Native ceremonies are being used in the treatment of non-native veterans suffering from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

Other ways we are honoring Native American Heritage Month include a screening of our film **Unspoken, America's Native American Boarding Schools** (www.pbsutah.org/events) and by including **Battle Over Bears Ears** in our award-winning **Book Club in a Box** program (www.pbsutah.org/bookclub). On Tuesday, November 23 at 8:00 p.m., we will also premiere the extraordinary new film from **Independent Lens, Home From School: The Children of Carlisle**. 



SPONSOR PROFILE



Utah Community Action's Weatherization program offers cost-effective home improvements and energy audits to Utahns in need, free of charge. The Weatherization program ensures families' well-being by helping to lower their energy bills, improve indoor air quality, and increase the comfort and safety of their homes year-round. The program is available to Utah renters and homeowners whose household income is 200% or less of the federal poverty level.

Founded in 1965, Utah Community Action is one of the largest nonprofit agencies dedicated to fighting poverty and its root causes in Utah. In addition to Weatherization, Utah Community Action offers five other core programs — Adult Education, Case Management & Housing, Head Start preschool, HEAT utility assistance, and Nutrition — to address barriers to self-reliance to empower individuals, strengthen families, and build communities in Utah.

The Weatherization process involves conducting a home inspection and a computerized energy audit, identifying cost-effective energy improvements that can be performed on the home — such as replacing incandescent lighting; repairing windows, doors, and furnaces; carbon monoxide testing; and wall, floor, ceiling, and duct insulation — and then making those improvements. Services that are not provided include: painting, roof repair, siding replacements, and installing storm windows or storm doors (unless they are shown to be cost-effective for a specific home). The Utah Community Action Weatherization program also provides energy education to residents so that they can continue using energy efficiently and keep common household costs low.

Homeowners or renters whose computerized energy audit of the residence shows a clear need are eligible for the Weatherization program. Applicants must be legal citizens of the United States. Precedence is given to elderly and disabled households, as well as those with children under the age of six. Utah Community Action's Weatherization program serves the following counties: Salt Lake, Tooele, Davis, Weber, and Morgan.

To apply, Utahns who meet the eligibility criteria can fill out an application online or by mail, along with all necessary documentation. Applicants can expect a verification letter within two weeks of submitting an application confirming that they **38**
