Customers who have active electricity, own their own residence, have working WiFi, and have a specific heating and cooling system are encouraged to fill out a short questionnaire and review the program's contract through the Vectren website. Eligible customers will also receive monthly energy tips and a bill credit from June 2016 – September 2016. Installations are already in progress but a few hundred spots are still open.

Reported and discussed a news story about the Vanderburgh County Sheriff's Office warning residents of a new phone scam popping up multiple times in the tri-state. Deputies say the caller claims to be a Deputy U.S. Marshal. The caller claims that someone in the household missed jury duty and that a bench warrant had been issued. The caller then says the offense can be cleared up by paying a fine and requested money cards from convenience stores. One victim lost nearly \$2,000 to the scammer. Residents are advised to treat any unsolicited caller who requests payment or access to personally identifiable information with extreme skepticism. The Sheriff's Department encourages residents to get the caller's name, hang up, and then call the business or government entity back at a phone number you know to be correct in order to verify the claim.

Topic: Lane Closures on Highway 41 for Repaving Project

Description of Program Content:

Reported and discussed a news story about lane closures in both directions for a large section of Highway 41 beginning Monday, June 27th as road crews started a repaving project. According to the Indiana Department of Transportation, the right hand lanes of both northbound and southbound 41 will be closed from approximately a half-mile south of I-69 all the way to Virginia Street, just north of the Lloyd Expressway interchange. The work is expected to run until late-August or early-September. At that point, crews will shut down left hand lanes in both directions to repeat the process on the right hand lanes. The entire project is expect to be complete by late Fall.
