At that time almost five million more acres of corn were anticipated for 2016 than were planted in 2015. In our part of Texas, wheat crops and many summer crops have already been planted, so this report doesn't have as much bearing on planting decisions as it might further north.

That money is used to promote beef across the state and the country as well as internationally.
