Lakes Country Radio partners with OBI to help spread the word about these drives and collect blood from our community. The OBI is the blood supplier for all hospitals in our listening area. OBI regional representative Ashley Hinson joined Blake on The Morning Rush every other Thursday to talk about their blood drives

Local Police Chief Natesafer King joined “Wide Awake with Kira and Blake to discuss both the dangers and what can be done to keep our kids safer, as they wait for their respective buses and walk to and from school.
- Amy Carter with “Team Tahlequah” sits in every Monday morning to educate listeners on the importance of shopping at local business and supporting small business owners. This has continued during the Covid-19 crisis and we’ve been able to help small businesses reach listeners about new hour changes, sales, delivery, etc.
