NFL Draft April 27, 2023 12 p.m., 4-6p.m.

KCTV provided in-depth coverage of the 2023 NFL Draft live from Union Station and the surrounding downtown areas on Thursday, April 27, 2023. Anchors provided coverage from the field, with Josh Jackson and Sharon Chen leading the noon newscast from the south lawn of the Liberty Memorial and Carolyn Long anchoring multiple evening shows leading up to the First Round of the Draft.

Pioneer Pallet Co. fire June 15, 2023 1:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.

With a fire breaking out at Pioneer Pallet Company in east Kansas City, Missouri, KCTV provided live breaking news coverage for more than two hours on Thursday, June 15, 2023. The fire did not lead to injuries for anyone but continued burning throughout the night and into Friday morning. Reporters Emily Rittman, Angie Ricono and Betsy Webster all provided live breaking news coverage from the scene as firefighters fought the flames. Along with coverage from on the ground, photojournalist Dwain Crispell shot live video with a drone overhead of the fire.

Jackson posted the \$100,000 bond Wednesday afternoon and was silent as he walked to a vehicle outside the Johnson County Courthouse.

Homeless man Mass St. attack May 26, 2023 6 p.m. 2:05 KCTV's Morgan Mobley went to Lawrence, Kansas, and reported a day after Lawrence Police said a homeless man approached and randomly attacked a couple in downtown Lawrence. The attack

happened around 10 p.m. Thursday night on Massachusetts Street. Both victims are going to be OK,

Mobley reports.

Infamous Kansas City Chiefs fan Xaviar Babudar, aka Chiefsaholic, was added to the Greater Kansas City crime stoppers 'Most Wanted' list. Babudar is wanted for robbing a bank near Tulsa, Oklahoma, in December. In March, he was charged with removing an ankle monitor and failed to appear in Oklahoma for a scheduled court appearance. An arrest warrant was issued for him with a \$1 million bond.
