Ahead of Super Bowl LVIII between the Kansas City Chiefs and San Francisco 49ers, KCTV provided comprehensive coverage with a team of reporters in Las Vegas with feature and news stories in a two-hour Road To Repeat special on Friday night. The coverage pre-empted the 10 p.m. news that Friday night and featured special anchoring from Las Vegas with anchor Carolyn Long and sports director Scott Reiss.

Chiefs win Super Bowl

Feb. 11, 2024

10:14 p.m. - 12:50 a.m.

After the Chiefs won Super Bowl LVIII in overtime 25-22 against the San Francisco 49ers, KCTV provides live coverage reacting to the game. Anchors Sharon Chen and Brad Stephens were in studio, with anchors Carolyn Long and Bill Hurrelbrink, as well as sports reporters Scott Reiss and Neal Jones reporting from Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas. KCTV reporters were also scattered throughout the Kansas City metro getting reaction from fans following the Chiefs' third Super Bowl win in the past five years.

Chiefs Super Bowl parade

KCTV provided live coverage from downtown Kansas City and at Union Station for the Chiefs' Super Bowl victory parade and rally. From 11 a.m. until 2 p.m. that coverage was commercial-free. The coverage was also streamed online with coverage of the back-to-back Super Bowl champions.

Chiefs Super Bowl rally shooting

Feb. 14, 2024

2 p.m. – 7 p.m.

As the Chiefs' victory rally wrapped up, a shooting happened just west of Union Station that killed a woman and injured 20 others. KCTV covered the story live, uninterrupted for five consecutive hours with live reports from reporters at the scene and live press conferences with police and medical personnel with updates throughout the evening.

Independence shooting kills officer, process server Feb. 29, 2024 2:36 p.m. – 6:57 p.m. KCTV provided live coverage from Eastern Jackson County after a shooting that killed a Jackson County Process Server and an Independence Police Officer. Independence Ofc. Cody Allen and process server Drexel Mack were killed after Mack tried to serve an eviction notice at a home on North Elsea Road in northeast Independence. KCTV provided live reports from the scene, the Jackson County coroner's office and a hospital throughout the evening.

Ofc. Cody Allen funeral March 8, 2024 11 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. KCTV covered fallen Independence Police officer Cody Allen's funeral from the Community of Christ Auditorium in Independence. It began Friday at 11 a.m. and KCTV covered with reporters at the church and throughout the processional route the services honoring Ofc. Allen.

KCTV reports a man is dead after a police shooting in Independence. Reporter Mark Poulose says officers were called to the area of North Frandsen Road – just north of E. Truman Road – after 4:30 p.m. Police said a man who had ammunition in a fanny pack and a gun near him was shot by IPD.

The former detective was convicted in the 2019 killing of Cameron Lamb and is currently serving a 6-year sentence. Ricono reports the obvious next step is a pus for a potential pardon, which his family and supporters have been hoping for.

3:30 p.m. The mother of 5-year-old Grayson O'Connor, who died after falling from the 17th floor of a Kansas City apartment building, appeared in court Monday morning. KCTV5's Joe Hennessy reports Corinne O'Connor and her representation are fighting against a charge of endangering the welfare of a child. O'Connor could face up to a life sentence if convicted.
