Former officer's conviction upheld Oct. 17 4 p.m. 0:57

This is continuing coverage of a high-profile case in Kansas City due to its ties to the Black Lives Matter Movement. A former KCPD officer shot and killed a Black man in 2019 and was convicted of second-degree involuntary manslaughter and armed criminal action. These charges have been upheld and DeValkenaere was taken into custody.

A small community was shocked by a murder-suicide that happened in a daycare parking lot in view of the couple's children, other daycare attendees, and parents. Community members were shocked that a violent incident of such magnitude had happened in their normally quiet town.

Dozens of tire slashings Nov. 20 10 p.m. 2:10

Just weeks before Christmas, dozens of people living in the Waldo neighborhood were left scrambling to get their tires replaced after a vandal went down several blocks and slashed dozens of car tires. Many people said their insurance doesn't cover vandalism so they were struggling to come up with the money to replace what was ruined for seemingly no reason.

KCTV covers the first court date of a man who raped and murdered a five-year-old who was living in the same homeless camp as him at the time of her death. Mikel Cherry has the potential to face the death penalty for his crimes, which community members say could have been avoided if their previous neglect claims hadn't fallen through the cracks.

Pregnant woman shot, killed Dec. 27 6 p.m. 2:57

Kansas City homicide rates hit record highs in 2023 after the death of a woman and her unborn child broke the previous record set in 2020. Chelsea Williams was standing outside her brother's house when she was shot by an unknown gunman, highlighting the senselessness of many of KC's shootings.

As a show of support for the Jewish community, a local middle school stood outside and greeted the students and staff of a nearby Hohrow school as they arrived. The heads of the schools had proviously

Honoring victims of crime Dec. 15 10 p.m. 3:25

Two mothers at a Victim Assistance holiday reception spoke about what they do to raise awareness for gun violence in their communities. Their sons were killed in previous years and the mothers want to honor their memories and help prevent other mothers from having to be put in the same position. This is as Kansas City reaches record levels of homicides in 2023.

KCTV reports hundreds of people were exposed to TB at a nearby high school, prompting concerns about the spread of the disease right at the start of the cold and flu season. The Johnson County Health Department said they are working diligently to inform parents of what needs to happen in terms of testing and prevention going forward.

Mental health symposium Oct. 17 12 p.m. 1:17

Mental Health KC hosted a symposium for the public to address building resilience in the community for mental health treatment and response. KCTV reports the group hopes to contribute to a more effective plan for the city going forward.

KCTV reports Warrior's Ascent is a veteran-run nonprofit that seeks to save the lives of veterans living with PTSD and other mental health issues. They have getaways and events for the veterans where they teach them mindfulness, meditation, and self-care, and provide therapy and community resources to the veterans in need.

They presented their findings to the mayor of Kansas City, hoping come up with insights and strategies to help KC work through the problem.

Homeless shelter outreach Dec. 20 12 p.m. 1:14

Shelter KC told KCTV they expected 700-800 people experiencing homelessness to need meals, warm clothes, hygiene kits, and a place to stay during the cold holiday season. They provided this through their yearly Christmas at the Crossroads event, which welcomes as many individuals as they possibly can to help get them through the dangerous cold.
