KCTV reports a local nurse has been accused of taking fentanyl from two local hospitals. A grand jury indicted Faith Naccarato on possession and tampering charges. She's accused of taking several vials of the powerful drug from Advent Shawnee Health and Menorah Medical Center.			
KCMO Prospect triple shooting	October 5, 2021	10pm	:17
KCTV reports three people are hurt after another triple shooting in Kansas City, MO. It happened this afternoon near the intersection of 50 <sup>th</sup> Street and Prospect Avenue. Two of the victims are in critical condition. This is the third triple shooting in Kansas City in just four days.

KCTV reports another grim milestone in the COVID pandemic. The American death toll has just hit 700 thousand. Many health experts didn't think we would reach this number after a vaccine was approved. The death toll includes over 12 thousand Missourians, and 6 thousand Kansans.			
Missouri medical marijuana	October 4, 2021	10pm	:18
KCTV reports another medical marijuana dispensary has been approved in Kansas City, MO. It should open later this month and is the state's 150 <sup>th</sup> dispensary. The Missouri Medical Cannabis Trade Association predicts \$200-million dollars in sales across the state by the end of the year.

All federal employees and contractors, and healthcare workers at facilities receiving Medicare or Medicaid have until January 4 <sup>th</sup> to be "fully" vaccinated.
