KCTV had live coverage with reporters in the area and broadcasted the entire fireworks display live that night.

KCTV5 broke into programming before our traditional newscast to provide live coverage of severe weather impacting the Kansas City metro area. The line of storms that entered the area caused a loss of power for nearly 100,000 residents in the area.

Nightclub shooter charges	July 7, 2023	6 p.m.	:45

The suspected shooter charged with killing three people at a nightclub in Kansas City, Missouri, was finally charged. The shooting also injured two others and was one of KCTV's leading stories for multiple days. An update from the Jackson County prosecutor involved graphics and court documents.

A man was charged with terroristic threatening, saying he was armed with an AK47 and explosives. It was all to help a friend get out of work at the Ford plant. KCTV sent a live reporter to get reaction from local law enforcement and to break down the scope of how much money was lost in stopping plant operations for a period of time.

Team coverage from multiple reporters provides information from where a police chase started in Lenexa and where it ended in Mission, Kansas, with a report that one suspect is dead and another is in custody.

Fairway Police Department officer Jonah Oswald has died at the age of 29. Oswald was a four-year veteran of the department. KCTV's Greg Payne reports from the Fairway Police Department headquarters as a memorial began to get set up. KCTV reports that 32-year-old Andrea Cothran will appear in Johnson County, Kansas, court on Tuesday. Cothran and Shannon Wayne Marshall, the suspect who was killed, are both from Tennessee.

A man was charged with second-degree murder in the death of a shoplifter at an O'Reilly Auto Parts Store in Kansas City, Kansas. KCTV sent a live reporter to the auto parts store it happened and used statements from the company and district attorney to cover the story.

A federal court upheld a Shawnee ordinance that restricts adult co-living. Three adults who are not related cannot live together in a single-family home. This makes it more difficult for young adults to live in the Shawnee community and housing activists are unhappy with the ruling.

A KU health official encouraged people to get their yearly COVID vaccines just like a flu shot.

Now, 3,000 residents have signed a petition to add it to the November ballot.

Nearly 11,000 kids in Missouri and nearly 45,500 kids in Kansas could lose childcare access if a government shutdown ends a federal childcare program.
