1st Quarter Special Programming Notes

KCTV made changes to or extended its normal programming for special and/or breaking news events. Or, provided in-depth coverage of special and/or breaking news events.

Those events for the 1st quarter of 2019 are:

KCTV Road to Atlanta Special

January 7 – February 1, 2019

KCTV broadcast a 30-minute special titled “Road to Atlanta.” It was broadcast Monday through Friday from 6:30pm-7:00pm for four consecutive weeks. The program followed the Kansas City Chiefs football team and their efforts to make the Super Bowl. The shows included feature stories on players and coaches, and live interviews from KCTV reporters. The program replaced “Inside Edition, which was moved to 4:30pm.

KCTV Winter Blitz Special

January 19, 2019

KCTV broadcast a special Saturday morning newscast titled “Winter Blitz.” It was broadcast from 5:00pm to 11:00am. The weather forecast called for heavy snow and cold temperatures. The broadcast consisted of live remotes and updates from several reporters and meteorologists on how the Kansas City area was dealing with the wintry conditions.

KCTV Road to Atlanta AFC Championship Special

January 20, 2019

KCTV broadcast a four-hour special titled “Road to Atlanta.” It was broadcast from 1:00pm to 5:00pm as a football pre-game show to CBS coverage of the AFC Championship game between the Kansas City Chiefs and New England Patriots. The broadcast included feature stories with players and coaches, and live interviews from KCTV reporters and meteorologists from Arrowhead Stadium.

KCTV In The Paint Special

March 21-22 and March 28-29, 2019

KCTV broadcast two 30-minute sports specials titled “In The Paint.” It was broadcast on Thursday and Friday at 5:30pm for two consecutive weeks. The program aired prior to CBS NCAA Basketball Championship coverage, and consisted of feature stories with players and coaches, and live reports from the Sprint Center in Kansas City where regional basketball games were played March 28-31st.
