KCTV reports the number of patients being admitted to Kansas City hospitals is reaching levels not seen since last January. Four- weeks ago hospitals were admitting an average of 70 new COVID-19 patients a day. That number has climbed steadily, and nearly doubled to 137 patients a day now.
