> Re: Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment WFSG, Panama City, FL Facility ID No. 6093 LMS File No. 0000063626

Dear Licensee,

On November 16, 2018, Florida State University (FSU), the licensee of Station WFSG(TV), Panama City, Florida (WFSG or the Station), filed a *Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment* requesting to modify the post-incentive auction transition phase assigned to the Station in the *Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice* from Phase 1 to Phase 2.¹ For the reasons below, we grant FSU's request for waiver and modify WFSG's phase assignment to Phase 2, as conditioned herein.

Background. Pursuant to the *Transition Scheduling Adoption Public Notice*, individual stations may request waiver and modification of their phase assignment.² A waiver is appropriate where the particular facts would make strict compliance inconsistent with the public interest and deviation from the general rule would relieve hardship, promote equity, or produce a more effective implementation of overall policy on an individual basis.³ The Media Bureau (Bureau) stated it will evaluate such requests on a case-by-case basis to assess the impact on the transition schedule, including the impact on other broadcasters as well as viewers, in order to facilitate a timely and orderly transition.⁴ The Bureau determined that it would view favorably requests that are compliant with the Commission's rules and

have little or no impact on the transition schedule.⁵ Requests that the staff determines would be likely to delay or disrupt the transition schedule will be viewed unfavorably.⁶

WFSG is currently licensed to operate on channel 38. It was reassigned to channel 28 in the *Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice* and assigned to transition Phase 1, which has a testing period start date of September 14, 2018, and phase completion date of November 30, 2018. WFSG states that its tower crew, Tower Consultants Incorporated (TCI), had planned to mobilize to the WFSG tower site between October 1 and October 15, 2018. However, due to the impact of Hurricane Michael, which hit the Panama City area on October 10, 2018, TCI was forced to delay its work.⁷ According to FSU, TCI has indicated that it can return to complete installation of WFSG's post-auction facility in early December 2018.⁸ FSU represents that it has all required parts and equipment on hand in order to complete WFSG's transition by the end of Phase 2. FSU also states that WFSG is not part of a linked-station set and will not delay any other Phase 1 station's transition.⁹

Discussion. Upon review of the facts and circumstances presented, we find that FSU's request to modify its phase assignment to permit WFSG to transition to its post-auction channel in Phase 2 satisfies the requirements for a waiver and is in the public interest. We agree that the change to WFSG's transition phase should not have an adverse impact on the overall transition schedule or a negative impact on other stations or viewers. Permitting FSU to transition WFSG to its post-auction channel in Phase 2 will benefit the public by allowing the Station to continue broadcasting during the post-hurricane recovery process without disruption. A staff analysis confirms that the phase change will not result in new increased pairwise interference above the two percent permitted during the post-auction transition period.¹⁰ Furthermore, this action will not result in viewers in the Panama City DMA being subject to an additional rescan period.¹¹ As a result, we find the benefits of this phase change in light of the delay caused by Hurricane Michael outweighs the short delay in access by wireless providers to the 600 MHz band.

We caution FSU that any additional expenses incurred as a result of the grant of WFSG's voluntary phase change may not be reimbursable from the TV Broadcasters Relocation Fund. Such additional costs might include, but may not be limited to, additional legal or engineering expenses; filing fees; and interim or additional equipment that was not contemplated when the station filed its initial estimated expenses but was subsequently necessitated to complete the transition to its post-auction channel due to its phase change.

Accordingly, we **GRANT** FSU's *Request for Modification and Waiver of Phase Assignment* and modify the transition phase assignment for WFSG from Phase 1 to Phase 2, subject to all the commitments made in its waiver request and compliance with all Commission rules applicable to transitioning stations.¹² Testing on the Station's post-auction channel may not begin until 12:01 am (local time) on December 1, 2018, and the Station is required to cease operating on its pre-auction channel no later than 11:59 pm (local time) on April 12, 2019.¹³ The Station's construction permit expiration date will also be modified to correspond to its new phase completion date.¹⁴

¹³ Each transition phase has a designated testing period on which a station in that phase may begin testing equipment on its new channel and a designated phase completion date when a station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. The phase completion date is the date that will be listed in that station's construction permit as its construction deadline and is the date the station must cease operation on its pre-auction channel. *See Closing and Channel Reassignment Public Notice*, 32 FCC Rcd at 2806, para. 64. A station that commences testing on its postauction channel before the beginning of its assigned testing period will be operating in violation of Commission rules.

If a station must commence operations on its post-auction channel at variance from the parameters authorized in its construction permit, it must file for and be granted special temporary authority prior to commencing operations. *See* 47 CFR § 73.1635. Grant of an extension of time to construct does not relieve a station of the requirement that it ceases operation on its pre-auction channel by its assigned phase completion date.
