With a lagging economy, organizations in the region push to promote their annual fundraisers and services. Several of these organizations utilized our morning talk shows and our ongoing community calendar to boost public interest.

In April, during our Health Week, several health care providers gave valuable advice, including a local physician, smoking cessation instructors from Rutland Regional Medical Center, Nutrition advocates, and even a clinical educator speaking about new technology for lifting patients.
