Organizers hosted a discussion this evening with parents at Salem High School. Police officers spoke about the drug epidemic's presence in the Roanoke Valley and gave parents advice about prevention. Speakers also included a local mother who lost her son to a drug overdose.

The General Assembly directed the state's Department of Education to come up with preliminary regulations on the use of seclusion and restraint. This afternoon they hosted the second of three roundtable discussion to get feedback from educators and parents.

Detailed Description: The challenges teachers face are well known. In exchange for modest pay, they are expected to inspire and introduce exciting new things to our kids. But the teaching profession is becoming more stressful and more dangerous. Research shows stress affects a teacher's job performance, their health and also your child's ability to learn. So what's the cause of the problem? First, the breakdown of the American family, add to that, the fact that students don't always respect their teachers and sometimes even violently attack them. All of it is leading to a nation of stressed out teachers who are leaving the profession.

The program recently lost its federal funding and needs 146 thousand dollars to keep it doors open until they can reapply next year.

Detailed Description: Homeless families in the Roanoke Valley will get some much needed help finding a place to live. This morning the United Way received \$40,000 from a relief agency to help fight homelessness.
