PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The Ronne's discussed how insecurities in a new marriage after widowhood can often create conflict and how that conflict and be addressed in a healthy manner. The noted ways that worked for them in overcoming the struggles in their new roles in their blended family of 8.

They are often repulsed or traumatized by the images they saw and feel an urge to seek out pornography again.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: According to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) data, suicide is the second leading cause of death among people ages 10-34. And even though suicide is pervasive, the stigma around depression causes many to suffer silently. Dr. Jantz described the important role of friends and how we can help a loved one that is sinking into despair. He noted that depression is a complex web that can affect anyone, regardless of age, health condition or life stage. Jantz noted a variety of approaches to try to help save someone who is thinking of taking their life.
