Fireworks Safety during this 4th of July Holiday time period	<p>Have a fun Independence Day, but done in a safe and legal manner. All fireworks sold from Fireworks Stands inside the city limits are safe & sane fireworks. These fireworks stay on the ground and don't travel outside of a 20 foot diameter. Make sure to have a bucket of water or hose close by when lighting fireworks. Always make sure adults are present when children are lighting sparklers. if there is a fire , call 911 . Anything that goes up into the air are aerials and require a permit. Aerial fireworks are a huge risk for causing wild fires. Two years ago, 63,000 acres were burned because of aerial fireworks. If an individual lights an aerial firework and it causes damage to a neighbors home or property, that individual may be liable for damages. If illegal fireworks are used inside the city limits, the IFFD can confiscate them and different penalties are associated with the circumstances. . To get a permit for aerials go to the fire prevention office at the I.F. Fire Dept. City code and requirements are on the Fire Dept website.
