Be watchful at dawn and dusk when deer are more active. If you see one deer, expect others, as deer seldom travel alone. Be alert and reduce speeds near wooded areas, green spaces, and water sources such as streams and ponds. Do not swerve to avoid hitting a deer. Motorists could then veer into oncoming traffic run off the road, hit objects or overturn.
