The plan involves getting 80 million dollars from a federal grant and limiting the cost to the city to 20 million dollars. The plan is controversial, with many business owners along Central worried about limiting access to their stores. Others wonder why we need a rapid bus transit; the city says this will help spur economic development along Central.
