within the city, teen meetups that would turn deadly & more, the question was posed to Garien Gatewood, Chicago's 1st ever Deputy Mayor for Community Safety, to discuss the difference between "public safety" & "community safety", the future of policing in Chicago and more. Gatewood puts a spotlight on how the city is looking to connect community policing organizations across the city to make it safer for its residents. The change to "community safety" from "public safety" includes more of a focus on not just police & firefighters, but more accessibility to mental health resources, streets & sanitation and other neighborhood based issues.

The Chicago City Council held a subject matter hearing over the Treatment Not Trauma ordinance and WBBM Political Editor Craig Dellimore will break down what it is, why it's in place and what'll happen in its future. Dellimore is joined by a panel to discuss Mayor Brandon Johnson's campaign promise that will re-open the mental health center closed under former mayor Rahm Emmanuel and providing a program that will send a mental health professionals to mental health emergencies instead of police officers. Dellimore asks the panel about the validity of the previous mayor's claim of the centers not being utilized by the people of Chicago and how it can change with Mayor Johnson backing it. Chicago's ability to handle mental health crises has been a hot topic for years and this episode of At Issue provides a platform for those who stand by the ordinance and advocate for why it can help the people of Chicago.

Kenneth Corey provides some details on how important the position of police superintendent is to people who may not understand exactly what the role entails, but also why it may not be as easy of a decision for Mayor Johnson.

WBBM Political Editor Craig Dellimore is joined by Eric Scheidler, the Executive Director of the Pro-Life Action League, to discuss reproductive rights, the organization's goal of saving unborn babies & more. Scheidler discusses the difficulty his organization has faced because of the decision and how public opinion is a leading cause of that. With Roe v. Wade being overturned at the federal level, Scheidler discusses how the fight now begins in Illinois have it overturned at the state level and how the Pro-Life Action League intends to go about it.

In part two of the discussion, WBBM Political Editor Craig Dellimore is joined by Brigid Leahy, the Vice President of Planned Parenthood of Illinois, to discuss the challenges Planned Parenthood has faced since Roe v. Wade was overturned. Leahy details how Planned Parenthood of Illinois had been preparing for the decision and how the organization would go about providing the proper resources for women to still have access to abortions within in Illinois or have to travel to do so.

The Cook County Board held a hearing on ways to overcome the fact that many Illinoisans were dying because of severe complications during childbirth & before and after pregnancy. This episode of At Issue tackles "Why is that?" & "What can we do about it?". WBBM Political Editor Craig Dellimore is joined by Cook County Commissioner Donna Miller, Congresswoman Robin Kelly and Dr. Gwendolyn Oglesby-Odom from Advocate Health to discuss the high rates of women facing severe complications or death related to childbirth. Dellimore asks the panel about why the numbers are higher for minorities within Illinois and how a lack of diversity within hospitals & pharmaceuticals may be one of the deciding factors. This At Issue provides a spotlight to address the lack of resources in certain pockets of Chicago and within the state of Illinois for certain minority groups.

X. SCHOOL REFORM AND EDUCATION

At Issue July 9, 2023

TOPIC: How the 2018 Parkland shooting could still have an effect on policing within schools

Guests: Retired Police Chief Tom Weitzel of Riverside, IL

30 minutes out of a 30-minute program

After a sheriff was found not guilty of negligence in connection to the 2018 Parkland, FL school shooting, the topic of policing within schools began to take effect. WBBM Political Editor Craig Dellimore is joined by Retired Police Chief Tom Weitzel to discuss the verdict and the effects that it might have in our community's schools & around the country and why the verdict should or shouldn't surprise you. Weitzel was police chief of Riverside, a suburb of Chicago, in 2018 when the Parkland shooting occurred and has been critical of the police response to the shooting. Weitzel discusses who exactly should be a school resource officer to help prevent other similar school shootings. Within the city of the Chicago, school resource officers are no stranger to local Chicago Public Schools and neighboring areas. Dellimore & Weitzel discuss how the Parkland shooting's effect on the police presence within Chicagoland area schools and how it changed after the Florida shooting.

Chicago Public Schools saw enrollment numbers stabilize for the first time in a decade, but a big problem that CPS is facing is getting the students to attend classes. With enrollment numbers staying the same, a big reason why may be because of the influx of non-English speaking students joining classrooms.
