#### **Issues & Programs for First Quarter**

#### **Placed in the Public File 4-10-19**

Issue: Grocery Shoppers, Low Earners Get Tax Relief in 2019

The New Year Brings tax Cuts to Arkansans, one for grocery shoppers and the other for lower income people. Groceries will drop from 1.5% to 0.125%.

The program aired January 3rd, 2019 at 7am. noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Arkansas AG Approves Ballot Title to Create Citizen's Redistricting Commission

Arkansans may get the chance to decide whether they want to change the way the state's congressional and state legislative districts are drawn up.

The program was 1.5 minutes in length and aired January 10th, 2019 on News at 7am, noon and 5pm News.

Issue: Boozman-Cardin Bill Advancing Women's Economic Empowerment

Donald Trump signed into law the *WEEE Act*, legislation that seeks to eliminate global

gender-related barriers and empower female entrepreneurs around the world.

The program was 2.0 minutes in length and aired January 18th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Important Meeting Regarding Hazard Mitigation Plan for Local Schools

The Berryville, Eureka Springs and Green Forest School Districts are working with Two Rivers Emergency Management to develop a hazard mitigation plan under FEMA to assess natural hazards' risk and vulnerabilities.

The program was 2.0 in length and aired January 20th, 2019, on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Tyson Foods and Walmart Commit Food and Money

Tyson's and Walmart each announce large commitment of money and food to help the more than 800,000 federal workers furloughed or working without pay during the government shutdown.

The program aired January 21st, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 1.5 minutes in length.

Issue: Prescription Drug Costs Unaffordable for Many

One-third of uninsured Americans did not take their medicine as prescribed to try to lower their costs. High price of prescription drugs is among nation's top concerns.

The program aired January 26th, 2019 at 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 1.0 in length.

Issue: Community Enrichment Grant Opportunities for 2019

The purpose of these grants is to support community-based programs that promote positive changes in the lives of the people of Berryville and Carroll County.

The program aired January 28th, 2019 at 7am, noon and 5pm news. and was 1.5 in length.

Issue: Severe Weather Awareness Week

Severe weather awareness week is February 24th through March 2nd. A different topic will be discussed each day. The Weather Service and ADEM want you to be proactive and not reactive.

The program aired February 5th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 2.0 minutes in length.

Issue: Quorum Court Hears of Dangerous Wiring in Courthouse

J.P.'s heard from Berryville's Building Inspector that he had found numerous places in the courthouse of inferior and dangerous wiring. Goins asked the Judge to let electrician inspect the main wiring in the courthouse offices.

The program aired February 10th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 1.0 minutes long.

Issue: National FFA Week Observed February 16th-23rd

The FFA Chapters of Berryville, Green Forest and Alpena, along with FFA Chapters across the country, are celebrating National FFA Week. Today's FFA members are the innovators and leaders of tomorrow. Through agricultural education and hands-on learning, they are preparing for 255 unique career opportunities in the food, fiber and natural resources industries.

The program was 3.0 in length and aired February 14th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Affordable Housing Coming to County

Desperately needed affordable housing is coming to Green Forest. Multi-unit apartments and houses will be built in phases.

The program aired February 20th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 3.0 minutes in length.

Issue: New Law Regulates Pharmacy Benefit Managers

Arkansas pharmacists should start seeing the side effects of a new state law that regulates the middlemen between them and insurance providers. Pharmacists blamed them for drastic cuts to their reimbursement rates.

The program aired February 23rd, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 1.5 minutes in length.

Issue: Online Sales Tax Has Good Chance of Passing in Arkansas

The long-debated online sales tax has its best chance of passing in Arkansas following a U.S. Supreme Court decision. It would require remote sellers to collect and remit sales tax for online purchases made in their states.

The program was 2.0 minutes in length and aired February 25th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: March 10-16th is Arkansas Agriculture Week

Gov. Hutchinson joined farmers, ag leaders and industry partners in declaring March 10-16 as Arkansas Agriculture Week. Agriculture provides one in every six jobs in Arkansas.

The program aired March 3, 2019 on Noon and 5pm news and was 3.0 minute long.

Issue: New Local Grant Cycle to Support Grade Level Reading Emphasis in our Schools

Carroll County Community Foundation announces a new, two-year grant initiative to support programs in Carroll County that work to increase literacy and reading proficiency in pre-school to 3rd grade students. This focus for this first year will be supporting our public school system.

The program was 3.0 minutes long and aired March 8th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Arkansas Senate Approves Referring to Voters in the 2020 General Election

A proposed constitutional amendment that would permanently extend the state's half-percent sales tax for highways that could raise \$205M a year more for highways.

The program was 1.5 minutes in length and aired March 13, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news.

Issue: Maker of Oxycontin in Court

As the nation's opioid crisis was deepening, the company that makes a powerful prescription painkiller considered marketing an anti-addiction drug to people with addictions.


The program aired March 16th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm news and was 2.0 minutes in length.

Issue: Tax Filers Seeing Lower Refunds

A handful of early tax filers are seeing unexpectedly low refunds, or worse, owing money to the IRS. While some Americans may see lower refunds most tax experts expect the refund rate to stabilize. And for some, their tax refunds will be higher this year.
