Issues & Programs for Second Quarter

Placed in the Public File 7-09-19

Issue: Arkansas Lawmakers Introduce Legislation to Expand State Veterans Cemetery

Sen.'s John Boozman and Tom Cotton along with Congressmen Crawford, Hill, Womack and Westerman introduced legislation to transfer nearly 140 acres of land at Camp Robinson to the Ark. Dept. of Veterans Affairs for expansion of a Veterans Cemetery.

The program aired April 6th, 2019 at 7am, noon and 5pm News. It was 2.5 minutes long.

Issue: Change of Ownership for Osage Creek Cultivation LLC

State Medical Marijuana Commission approved changes in ownership for Carroll County's Osage Creek Cultivation. Owner's, the Trulove Family, changed the percentages of ownership for four family members.

The program aired April 15, 2019 at 7am, noon and 5pm News. It was 1 minute long.

Issue: Judge Rejects Request to Dismiss Lawsuit Against Three Drugmakers

An Arkansas judge has rejected a request to dismiss the state's lawsuit against three drugmakers that alleges they made false marketing claims about benefits and risks of opioids.

Issue: County Judge Appoints Advisory Board for Public Safety Sales Tax

Justices's of the Peace passed an Ordinance creating a Public Safety Advisory Board to study options for a potential sales tax to upgrade communications equipment. The County's aging equipment has become unreliable.

Issue: New Bill Will Require School Districts to Offer Online Courses to Expelled Students

A bill passed in the latest legislative session will require school districts to offer online courses to expelled students so they can receive credit. The proposal passed the House and Senate.

The program aired April 25th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm News. 2 minutes long.

Issue: Senior Farmer's Market Nutrition Program

The USDA Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program provides one \$50 coupon book per household to senior adults age 60 and older to purchase locally grown fresh vegetables, fruits, herbs and honey. Seniors must meet income eligible requirements.

The program aired April 28th, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm News. 1.5 minutes long.

Issue: Broadband Internet Coming to Rural Arkansas

The FCC promises millions to expand broadband internet to rural parts of the state. The FCC will give over \$18M over the next decade to increase the access of broadband for more than 5,000 Arkansas homes and businesses.

The program aired May 3rd, 2019 on 7am, noon and 5pm News. 1.0 minute long.

Issue: Online sales tax Bill Sails in Arkansas Senate

A bill that would change several tax laws - including requiring out of state online sellers to collect sales and use taxes from in-state purchasers and changing the state's corporate income tax code.

Issue: Marijuana Edibles Face Restriction

Arkansas medical marijuana cultivators who intend to manufacture edibles will face some restrictions on what products they can produce and what those products can look like.

Issue: Click It or Ticket Campaign Starts May 20th

Sheriff's Office and State Police remind all drivers of the importance of seat belt use. Aimed at enforcing seat belt use to help keep families safe. Carroll County fatalities have doubled in the past four years.

Issue: Connect 4 Program Graduates First Class

Connect 4 is a partnership with the 3 Carroll County public schools as a way to introduce high school students to the industrial maintenance world.

Issue: School Bus Drivers Say Increase in Illegal Passes of Stopped Buses

Arkansas bus drivers recently reported an alarming 884 instances of motorists illegally passing stopped school buses in one day.

Issue: State Agencies Helping with Arkansas River Flooding

The State Emergency Operations Center continues to be activated at Level I in response to rising water-levels and expected flooding along the Arkansas River.

Issue: President Trump Signs Emergency Declaration for Arkansas

FEMA announced federal emergency aid has been made available to the state to supplement state and local response efforts which have the purpose of alleviating the hardshp and suffering caused

Issue: Carroll Electric Coop to Receive \$263M to Improve Electrical Grid
