10/8/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	The Butler County Treasurer is leading a campaign to stem the number of home foreclosures. The Save Our Homes program provides workshops for borrowers and helps them rebuild their credit. Foreclosures in the county are up 88% since 2991.
10/10/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	The Clermont County Business Workforce Resource Center (BWRC) holds grand opening for a transition center at the Batavia Transmissions. The center is designed to assist dislocated employees in receiving training or guidance to secure other employment, as a result of the anticipated closing (next year) of the Ford plant.
10/15/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Getting ready for the winter cold ... Duke energy is offering a home energy audit this year to customers (not BASED ON INCOME), also giving out a kit with some energy savers, and you can sign up for a program that will shut down your A/C during peak hours to save you money. The improved interchange will open up 600 undeveloped acres for commercial development in Liberty Township and at complete build-out in 20 years, approximately 10,000 new jobs are projected with an annual payroll of \$250 million.

10/5/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	FORT THOMAS DEER - National Humane Association getting involved in the community's proposal to have police and bow hunters shoot deer to curb their rising population. Apparently the city's public safety committee now has this proposal and it's not expected to come before council again until late October or early November.
10/8/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Grant Co. KY: The Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet assured the public today that drinking water from municipal water supplies is safe to consume despite drought-induced changes in taste and smell. The changes are attributable to low water supplies, high temperatures and supplemental water treatment, say state and local water officials.
10/10/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	The Sharonville Planning Commission will hear a presentation by Fisher Homes concerning a development at the RELIS campus in Sharonville. Because there is some community opposition to the plan, many residents are expected to attend this meeting. The most opposed citizens are part of a group called "Guardians Of The Relis Nature Preserve." The property in question now contains a school and large wooded nature center. Previous plans from the developer include hundreds of apartment-style condos, single-family homes and the total loss of the nature center. This has caused residents to oppose the development.

He's introduced legislation in Congress to extend the life of the Delta Queen. 10/29/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Hamilton's development of the old Mosler Safe Company into a Kroger plaza is getting high marks from the EPA. Hamilton is one of a few cities to get recognition for its brownfield efforts. What once was property possibly contaminated is now the site of a new Kroger store.
10/30/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	One building at Maple Knoll Village was evacuated, including 60 units. The residents from that building were allowed back in shortly after noon. This was necessary because of an inadvertent mix of chemicals for the pool. A worker put chlorine into a tub that had another chemical in it and the combination created chlorine vapors. 40 workers at Maple Knoll were evaluated due to burning eyes and respiratory complaints -- 10 of those were transported for precautionary reasons. None of them was unconscious or on a stretcher.
11/5/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	LEAD TEST KITS: With all the headlines about the dangers of lead paint in toys, you're seeing a lot more Home Lead Test Kits which are supposed to make parents feel safer. Just how accurate are these Tests? Can you trust them? We partnered up with the Cincinnati Health Department to put the Tests to the Test. How dangerous are the toys in your child's closet or on store shelves? We take a variety of toys from several different sources to the Health Department and have them tested for Lead content. 10/3/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Miami University is installing a huge spectrometer on campus. It symbolizes the school's push toward medical-driven research. While Miami does not does not have a medical school, officials believe the new tool will help them compete for research.
10/15/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Hamilton City School Officials are getting the word out about rumors of a possible threat. Last Thursday, a parent contacted the school saying their child heard that another student was going to come to school sometime before he was a senior and shoot people. School administrators contacted Hamilton police who sent officer out to question student. The student is a male sophomore. Police say the student does not face charges and they do not have any physical evidence yet to indicate the student even made a threat. But rumors about the alleged threats spread over the weekend when students began texting each other. Some students even heard that there were bomb threats or that the student in question brought a gun to school... police say none of those rumors is true. Still, some parents are showing up at Hamilton High School today to pull their children out of class.

This continues a trend of declining enrollment---down an average of 3 percent in recent years. Program cuts are getting much of the blame. Middletown voters are being asked once again to dig deeper into their pockets. Not only are they being asked to pass a public safety levy but the school district is asking for passage of a school tax levy.

It's put on by a retired army officer who handled security for the joint chiefs of staff and served as the director of security for the public school system in Washington DC. Administrators and representatives from several area school districts including Amelia, Batavia, Deer Park, Northwest will attend.

Account4Me is a unique computerized communication system that allows universities to notify, identify or help locate staff, faculty and students during a crisis.
11/1/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Grandview Elementary Principal, Candice Simpkins will have her head shaved by 35 outstanding writers that scored Proficient or Distinguished on their On Demand Assessment last spring. It's the fulfillment of a promise Simpkins made to them as fourth-graders. At that time, only two of the approximately 60 students ranked as proficient in the state's CATS testing. She promised that if half of them became proficient the next year, they could take her hair. The results came in earlier this year: 29 proficient with six more ranking distinguished. The school's biennium goal on the CATS testing for the 2007-08 school year was 81.9. This year's testing has put them at 85.5.
11/7/07	4/5/6/10/11PM	Middletown school board meets to discuss what they can restore to the budget after winning approval of its tax renewal. a) Where will they find the new teachers they have to hire after extending the school day? b) Will coaches continue "volunteering" their services as winter sports get into full swing? c) How will pay to play be affected?

Police say he repeatedly offered the children a ride and when they asked a neighbor for help he told them to mind their own business and kept on asking the children to get in his vehicle.

After issuing the male driver a speeding citation and the female passenger an open flask citation, the vehicle drove off. A short distance away, the deputy saw the vehicle pulled off to the side of the roadway and turned around to check on the occupants. As he approached the vehicle, the male passenger waved the deputy down, informing him the female occupant had been shot. She was transported to U.C. Hospital where she was pronounced dead a short time later. The occupants of the vehicle are the only persons believed to be involved in this incident.
